1. Call to Order

Mr. Williams called the meeting to order at 3:05pm.

2. Conflict of Interest Reminder

Mr. Williams asked if any members had a conflict of interest with any items on the meeting agenda. No members reported having a conflict of interest.

3. Approval of Agenda

Mr. Watkins made the motion to approve the agenda for today's meeting. Ms. Swearingen seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

4. Approval of Minutes

The minutes for the July 13, 2016 Work Session and the July 27, 2016 meeting were approved unanimously.

5. Public Comment Period

Ms. Florence Schroeder addressed members regarding road conditions in the Waterford Place subdivision in Myrtle Grove. Ms. Schroeder read a statement regarding her and her neighbor's concerns about the roads in their neighborhood and asked that they be repaired and maintained.

Following her request for assistance, Mr. Doetsch told Ms. Schroeder that NCDOT would need to address the matter. Mr. Doetsch asked Ms. Collette, NCDOT Division Engineer if she could speak to members of the community in attendance regarding road conditions and maintenance in Waterford Place subdivision. Ms. Collette said she will meet with the neighborhood representatives immediately following today's meeting.

Mr. Alvin Rogers addressed members regarding alternatives for widening College Road. Mr. Rogers presented his suggestion for the one-way pair alternative and he asked members to consider his suggestion for the one-way alternative rather that building an overpass at the intersection.

Mr. Kozlosky told members that a presentation will be made to the City Council at their September 19th meeting regarding at-grade vs. grade separated interchanges. He stated that the Department is currently evaluating the different alternatives and no decision has been made.

Ms. Linda LaPrice addressed members regarding road conditions in the Waterford Place subdivision in Myrtle Grove. She questioned why builders are allowed to build without getting approval on streets on which they are building. She asked why the rules and laws regarding streets in a subdivision are not being enforced.

Mr. Braden Willis addressed members regarding traffic on the Cape Fear Memorial Bridge. He suggested that a median barrier gate be installed that will allow traffic to turn around and move off the bridge and to allow drivers to choose an alternate route into Wilmington. He also suggested that a helipad be added to serve emergency medical personnel when an ambulance is unable to get across the bridge due to traffic or bridge issues. Mr. Willis told members that he's been reading about the transportation plans for the rail corridor in the area. He noted that with the possibility of a rail-yard expansion in the Leland/Navassa area, he cautioned members to consider the potential risks involved in the transportation and storage of hazardous chemicals at the rail-yard.

Mr. Andy Koeppel addressed members regarding agenda items 7.c (Resolution encouraging the North Carolina Department of Transportation to provide notifications and implement restrictions for work on the Cape Fear Memorial Bridge and work toward the long-term replacement of the bridge) on the Consent Agenda. Mr. Koeppel told members that he questioned that replacement is the word that we want. He suggested that "alternate" might be a more appropriate word. He noted that the Cape Fear Memorial Bridge will remain in place after a southern bridge is built.

Mr. Watkins noted that the word replacement caught him off-guard as well when he saw it on the news. It may be confusing to the general public.

6. Presentation

a. Joint FHWA/FTA Certification Review, Ron Lucas, FHWA

Mr. Ron Lucus gave a brief overview of the FHWA/FTA Certification Review that took place on April 14th. He told members that the Certification Review included a desk audit, a public comment meeting and an on-site review. Mr. Lucus reviewed the commendations and recommendations from the review committee. He noted that no corrective actions were identified during the audit. He congratulated the MPO staff on their successful certification review.

b. Section 5310 Program, Albert Eby and Vanessa Lacer, CFPTA

Mr. Eby and Ms. Lacer gave a presentation on the Cape Fear Public Transportation Authority's Section 5310 Program.

Mr. Eby gave a brief overview of the Section 5310 Elderly and Disabled program and CFPTA's accomplishments since becoming the designated recipient. Mr. Eby noted that one of the requirements for eligibility was the development of the Program Management Plan (PMP). As outlined in the PMP, Ms. Vanessa Lacer was hired as the Mobility Manager to oversee the program's activities.

Ms. Lacer told members that on a Federal level, the mission of the Section 5310 program is to remove barriers to public transportation. She gave a brief overview of educational opportunities and activities being offered to eligible recipients through the new WAVE Connect program.

7. Consent Agenda

a. Opening of the 30-day public comment period for STIP/MTIP Amendments (August)

- b. <u>Resolution approving STIP/MTIP Amendments (June and July)</u>
- c. <u>Resolution encouraging the North Carolina Department of Transportation to provide</u> notifications and implement restrictions for work on the Cape Fear Memorial Bridge and work toward the long-term replacement of the bridge
- d. <u>Resolution supporting a modification in project limits for the Cape Fear Boulevard Multi-use</u> <u>path Project</u>

Ms. Batleman asked that Item c. be pulled from the consent agenda for discussion.

Mr. Williams made the motion to approve Item a., b. and d. on the consent agenda. Mr. Miller seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Ms. Batleman told members that she had made suggested changes to the original resolution in an effort to give the resolution more emphasis.

Mr. Watkins told members he is not sure that the members of the WMPO have gone as far as to identify that a new Cape Fear Memorial Bridge is an urgent need for replacement. He asked if we are looking at a fourth crossing as the next step. He said he felt that that part of the motion is placing the WMPO's emphasis on a new Cape Fear Memorial Bridge, rather than a fourth crossing. The wording indicates that we are placing greater weight on the replacement of that bridge, as opposed to what the real factor is. He said he understand closures and inconveniences as stated in the resolution, but he has a problem supporting replacement for the Cape Fear Memorial Bridge, as opposed to working on a fourth crossing.

Mr. Kozlosky reminded members that work is still being done on the Environmental Document for identifying whether a new crossing is a more viable option or upgrading the existing route. The draft document is expected in 2017. He told members that even if a new crossing is built, there will still be a need to replace the Cape Fear Memorial Bridge.

Mr. Watkins noted that it is his personal opinion that the resolution has too narrow a focus as opposed to requesting action on another crossing of some sort.

Mr. Williams told members that even if we do get a southern route, the Cape Fear Memorial Bridge will have to be replaced. The proposed resolution makes sure this gets the attention it needs from NCDOT.

Ms. Batleman told members that we have a situation where we won't know until next year what corridor will be selected for the fourth crossing. What is the likelihood that funding will be identified to pay for a fourth crossing and what is the likelihood that we would get the funds to replace the Cape Fear Memorial Bridge.

A general discussion followed regarding past efforts on the issues involved in establishing a southern route across the Cape Fear River.

Mr. Anderson suggested that we need a "fixed bridge" as opposed to a "lift bridge". He suggest that the resolution should state that "....requests the North Carolina Department of Transportation to begin planning for the necessary replacement of the Cape Fear Memorial Bridge and/or an alternative fixed bridge as quickly as possible." Ms. Swearingen suggest taking out the "/or" from the wording.

Mr. Williams told members the whole point of the resolution is to just make sure it's on the radar of NCDOT, but eventually this bridge will have to be replaced.

Ms. Batleman told members that she feels that the important message here is to assure commuters using the Cape Fear Memorial Bridge that the WMPO Board is not ignoring the problem. She noted that it's important that the bridge replacement be brought to the attention of the Department now and not later.

Following discussion on wording for the resolution, Mr. Williams suggested that staff put the resolution back on the agenda for the next meeting in order to get the wording right using the feedback from the Board today.

Mr. Kozlosky told members that it appears that there are two issues being addressed in the resolution. The first is the maintenance issues and the problems with advanced notification of closures. The other issue is the desire to replace the Cape Fear Memorial Bridge and also look to continue the study for the Cape Fear Crossing project. He asked members if it would be better if the two issues were separated and bring back separate resolutions for consideration.

Consensus of the board was bring back two separate resolutions.

Mr. Watkins made the motion to table the resolution in order for staff to revise the resolution as directed by the Board. Mr. Williams seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

8. Regular Agenda

a. <u>Resolution adopting the Wilmington Urban Area MPO's 2016 Congestion Management Process</u> <u>Biennial Report</u>

Ms. Doliboa told members that the report is the first Congestion Management Process Biennial Report. She noted that when the MPO was designated as a Transportation Management Area (TMA), FHWA required that the WMPO complete a Congestion Management Process. Ms. Doliboa said the purpose of the biennial report is to demonstrate how the WMPO's regional network is preforming according to the CMP performance measures. She explained how the data was collected and how the data was used for evaluating the segments. Mr. Doliboa stated that the next step is to facilitate the implementation of the strategies to improve the CMP network. The data from the report will also be used as a component in the MTP project selection process.

A brief question/answer and discussion period followed.

b. <u>Resolution adopting the FY 2017 Surface Transportation Block Grant Program (STBGP)</u> <u>Submittal Guide and Competitive Process</u>

Mr. Lowe reminded members that the STP-DA and TAP-DA programs are being combined at the Federal level. Mr. Lowe noted that effectively there's not much change in how the programs operate at the MPO level other than the name change to Surface Transportation Block Grant Program and the Transportation Alternatives Set Aside. He told members the submittal guides for both the Surface Transportation Block Grant Program - Direct Attributable and the Transportation Alternatives Set Aside - Direct Attributable guide have been updated for the 2017 allocations. The two primary changes are that this year's submittal will require a detailed opinion of probable construction costs that has been prepared by a licensed engineer. Staff will also require a project schedule that highlights key milestones and coordinates the schedule with NCDOT and WMPO. Mr. Lowe said the new requirements will help provide a good picture and understanding of the project process and timelines, and also help to ensure that the projects are moving forward.

Mr. Williams made the motion to adopt the FY 2017 Surface Transportation Block Grant Program (STBGP) Submittal Guide and Competitive Process. Ms. Batleman seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

c. <u>Resolution adopting the FY 2017 Transportation Alternatives Set Aside-Direct Attributable</u> (TASA-DA) Submittal Guide and Competitive Process

Ms. Batleman made the motion to adopt the FY 2017 Transportation Alternatives Set Aside-Direct Attributable (TASA-DA) Submittal Guide and Competitive Process. Mr. Williams seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

d. <u>Resolution requesting the North Carolina Department of Transportation begin right of way</u> <u>acquisition for the Hampstead Bypass</u>

Mr. Piepmeyer made the motion to request the North Carolina Department of Transportation begin right of way acquisition for the Hampstead Bypass. Ms. Batleman seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

e. <u>Resolution encouraging the North Carolina Board of Transportation to support a</u> <u>bicycle/pedestrian crossing on 17th Street at New Hanover Regional Medical Center</u>

Mr. Kozlosky told members that the Wilmington City Council approved a 720 space parking deck on the west side of 17th Street at New Hanover Regional Medical Center at their meeting on August 16th. He noted that New Hanover Regional Medical Center identified the building of an elevated structure over 17th Street as Phase II of the project. Mr. Kozlosky stated that in order to build such an encroachment, it will be necessary for the State Board of Transportation to approve.

Mr. Kozlosky stated that the Technical Coordinating Committee expressed concern regarding an elevated structure across 17th Street so language was add to the resolution at their request stating "WHEREAS, the Port of Wilmington is a major economic driver for the region, 17th Street is a designated detour route for the Port and an elevated walkway should be designed to accommodate oversized freight truck traffic to/from the Port of Wilmington."

Mr. Anderson made the motion to adopt the Resolution encouraging the North Carolina Board of Transportation to support a bicycle/pedestrian crossing on 17th Street at New Hanover Regional Medical Center. Mr. Williams seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

9. Discussion

a. STIP/MTIP Modifications (August)

Mr. Kozlosky told members that staff will be bringing STIP/MTIP Modifications back to the next meeting for consideration.

b. WMPO Bylaw Amendment

Mr. Kozlosky said staff is asking for direction from the Board regarding member absences. In April the Board members amended the bylaws to state that if members missed 3 or more meeting, a letter would be sent to the chief elected official of the board the member represents. Mr. Kozlosky said there has been question about whether that would be unexcused absences, so staff wanted to get direction as to if the Board wanted to provide excused and unexcused absences. If that is the desire, staff will bring an amendment to the board at the next meeting.

Consensus by the Board members was for staff to bring an amendment to the bylaws regarding excused/unexcused absences and alternate member participation for consideration by the Board to the next meeting.

c. Public Participation Plan Update

Mr. Kozlosky told members that staff is working to update the Public Participation Plan and will bring it to the Board in October.

d. Organizational Structure

Mr. Kozlosky told members that in April, staff was asked for information on how other MPO organizations are hosted throughout the state. Staff provided a memo that outlined this information and compared the five different organizational structures.

Mr. Williams told members he requested that staff look into this at the April meeting. He noted that this is not in any way intended to reflect negatively on the City of Wilmington. Mr. Williams explained that as it stands right now, staff has a chain of command. Does Mr. Kozlosky report the City of Wilmington or does he report to the Board? Mr. Williams said the other issue is the total geographic area the MPO serves. Mr. Williams suggested that the Board look at what the advantages/disadvantages of moving toward the Leaning Independent model and preserve the relationship with the City of Wilmington. No decision needs to be today but it is time to begin discussions.

A general discussion followed regarding the need to continue investigating the options. Consensus of the Board members was for the organizational structure to remain as it is currently.

10. Updates

Project updates for the Crossing over the Cape Fear River Work Group, Wilmington MPO, Rail Realignment Task Force, CFPTA. NCDOT Division and NCDOT Planning Branch are included in the agenda packet.

10. Adjournment

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 5:05pm

WHEREAS, the Transportation Advisory Committee has found that the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization is conducting transportation planning in a continuous, cooperative, and comprehensive manner; and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Board of Transportation adopted the 2016-2025 State Transportation Improvement Program on June 4, 2015 and the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization adopted the Statewide/Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program on June 24, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization desires to modify the State/Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Programs for projects EB-5534, U-4751A, C-5702B and C-5702C.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Board of the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization hereby approves amending 2016-2025 State/Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Programs for projects EB-5534, U-4751A, C-5702B and C-5702C.

ADOPTED at a regular meeting of the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization's Board on September 28, 2016.

BYLAWS WILMINGTON URBAN AREA TRANSPORTATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE

ARTICLE I – NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Wilmington Urban Area Transportation Advisory Committee, hereinafter referred to as the "TAC".

ARTICLE II – PURPOSE

The purposes of the TAC are outlined in the most recent "Memorandum of Understanding" approved by the appropriate local governments.

ARTICLE III – MEMBERS

<u>Section I – Number of Qualifications</u>: The TAC shall consist as specified in the "Memorandum of Understanding". The eligible voting member list consists of a representative from each of the appropriate boards with the City of Wilmington having two representatives.

<u>Section II – Terms of Office</u>: All elected representatives serving on the TAC may serve for the length of their elected terms. A member may serve successive terms.

<u>Section III – Alternates</u>: Each of the appropriate boards shall designate all members of their governing board who are not members of the TAC as alternate members of the TAC. In the event that a member is unable to attend, that member or the chief elected officer of that jurisdiction will designate an alternate to attend and participate in the member's absence. That alternate member may serve as a full voting member during any meeting where one of that board's representatives is not in attendance. Proxy and absentee voting are not permitted.

ARTICLE IV – OFFICERS

<u>Section I – Officers Defined</u>: The TAC shall, upon majority vote of its membership, appoint one voting member of the Committee to act as Chairman and one voting member to act as Vice-Chairman. A member of the staff of the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization will serve as Secretary to the Committee.

<u>Section II – Duties</u>: The Chairman shall call and preside at meetings and appoint committees. In absence of the Chairman, the Vice-Chairman shall preside and complete all duties of the Chairman.

<u>Section III – Elections</u>: The Chairman and Vice-Chairman shall be elected annually by the voting members of the TAC, with their terms to begin at that meeting. In the event that there is no Chairman or Vice-Chairman, the TCC Chairman shall preside until a Chairman and Vice-Chairman are elected. The Chairman and Vice-Chairman shall serve for a period of one (1) year from their election and may be re-elected.

ARTICLE V - MEETINGS

<u>Section I – Meetings:</u> Regular schedules will be adopted by the TAC at the first meeting of the calendar year. If there is insufficient reason for a regularly scheduled meeting, as determined by the Chairman, the Secretary will notify TAC members of the meeting's cancellation. Meetings shall be conducted under parliamentary procedures consistent with <u>Robert's Rules of Order</u>.

A Special or Emergency meeting is a separate session of society held at a time different from that of a regular meeting, and convened only to consider one or more items of business specified in the call of the meeting. Notice of the time, place and exact purpose of the meeting must be mailed to all members a reasonable number of days in advance. The reason for the special or emergency meeting is to deal with important matters that may arise between regular meetings and that urgently require action by the society before the next regular meeting. As in the case of a regular meeting, the session of a special or emergency meeting in an ordinary society is normally concluded in a single meeting, unless the assembly at the special meeting schedules an adjourned meeting.

<u>Special Meetings</u> – The Chairman or a majority of board members may at any time call a special meeting of the Committee by signing a notice stating the time and place of the meeting and the subjects to be discussed. The person or persons calling the meeting shall cause the notice to be posted at City Hall in downtown Wilmington or the door of the regular meeting place at least forty-eight hours before the meeting. In addition, the notice shall be e-mailed or mailed to individuals and news organizations. Only items of business specified in the notice may be transacted at a special meeting.

<u>Emergency Meetings</u>- If a special meeting is called to deal with an unexpected circumstance requiring immediate consideration, the notice requirements of this rule do not apply. However, the person or persons calling an emergency meeting shall take responsible action to inform the other board members and the public of the meeting. Local news organizations having requested notice of the special meetings shall be notified of such emergency meetings by the same method

used to notify the board members. Only business connected to the emergency may be discussed at this meeting.

Section II- TAC Sub-Committees: The Transportation Advisory Committee may create Sub-Committees to assist with forwarding the mission and goals of the Wilmington MPO. These Sub-Committees shall be created by a formal vote of the Transportation Advisory Committee. The notice of Sub-Committee meetings shall be posted at City Hall in downtown Wilmington or the door of the regular meeting place at least forty-eight hours before the meeting. In addition, the notice shall be e-mailed or mailed to all Transportation Advisory Committee members and news organizations.

<u>Section III– Quorums and Majority Vote:</u> A quorum is required for the transaction of all business, including conducting meetings or hearings, participating in deliberations or voting upon or otherwise transacting public business. A quorum consists of 51% of the members of the TAC, plus as many additional members as may be required to ensure that 51% of the possible votes are present.

<u>Section IV– Attendance</u>: Each member shall be expected to attend each scheduled meeting. <u>Any Board member asking to be excused shall require a call</u> to the MPO's Executive Director at least 24 hours in advance of the meeting. The <u>Executive Director will at the beginning of the Board meeting, list the members</u> requesting to be excused which will require a vote from the Board to approve these excused absences. If an Alternate attends a meeting in place of the <u>member, this will not count as an absence for the member.</u> For members not attending three (3) consecutive TAC meetings, the Chairman will send to the chief elected officer of the jurisdiction of the member in question, a letter indicating the number of absences and requesting re-affirmation or redesignation of the jurisdiction's representative.

ARTICLE VI – VOTING PROCEDURES

<u>Section I – Majority Votes</u>: Any member may call for a vote on any issue provided that it is seconded and within the purposes set forth in the "Memorandum of Understanding." Each voting member of the TAC shall have one vote, and a majority vote of those present and voting shall constitute approval of any motion, provided a quorum exists. Abstentions are not included in the tally of the votes. Proxy and absentee voting are not permitted.

<u>Section II – Agenda</u>: The agenda is the list of items suggested for discussion at a TAC meeting. Agenda items originate as a carry-over from previous meetings, are placed on the agenda prior to its distribution by any member of the TAC, by request from any jurisdiction party to the "Memorandum of Understanding," or by the request of a member of the Technical Coordinating Committee (TCC). TCC and TAC members may submit an item(s) to their respective TCC and TAC agendas. In order for a Board member to submit an item(s) to the TCC or TAC, the item(s) must be submitted no later than 5:00 p.m. the first business day of the calendar month in which the item is requested to be considered. The item must include all pertinent background materials (resolution, maps, etc.). The TAC shall approve the agenda at the beginning of each meeting. At this time, the TAC shall have the ability to add or remove any item on the agenda by a super-majority vote of the TAC's voting members present. An item added to the agenda will be placed for consideration at the end of the meeting.

ARTICLE VII – AMENDMENTS TO BYLAWS

Amendments to these Bylaws of the TAC shall require the affirmative vote of at least two-thirds (2/3) of the eligible voting members, provided that written notice of the proposed amendment has been received by each member at least seven (7) days prior to the meeting at which the item is to be considered and provided that such amendment does not conflict with the letter or the fundamental intent of the "Memorandum of Understanding" governing this document. In the event of any conflict, the "Memorandum of Understanding" shall carry precedence over these Bylaws.

WHEREAS, the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization provides transportation planning services for the City of Wilmington, Town of Carolina Beach, Town of Kure Beach, Town of Wrightsville Beach, Town of Belville, Town of Leland, Town of Navassa, New Hanover County, Brunswick County, Pender County, Cape Fear Public Transportation Authority and the North Carolina Board of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, the Cape Fear Memorial Bridge was completed in 1969 and provides a critical link between New Hanover and Brunswick Counties; and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Department of Transportation is responsible for the operation of traffic flow and maintenance on state maintained roadways and bridges; and

WHEREAS, the Cape Fear Memorial Bridge is maintained by the North Carolina Department of Transportation and the bridge requires on-going up-keep, inspections, and maintenance which impacts traffic flow between New Hanover and Brunswick Counties; and

WHEREAS, the frequent lane closures for maintenance have created severe safety hazards to those using the bridge; and

WHEREAS, advanced notifications, timing of work (day vs. night) and the time of year in which the work is being completed all could mitigate the safety hazards and minimize the impacts to traffic flow on the bridge and between New Hanover and Brunswick Counties.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Board of the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization hereby urgently requests the North Carolina Department of Transportation provide advanced notifications prior to the initiation of any work to be completed, schedule work during off-peak travel periods, work during the night and also do not complete any work between Memorial Day and Labor Day unless there is an emergency issue.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF WRIGHTSVILLE BEACH, NORTH CAROLINA REQUESTING THAT THE NORTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND THE WILMINGTON URBAN AREA METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION EXPLORE THE FEASIBILITY OF FUTURE ALTERNATIVES FOR BRIDGE ACCESS FROM THE MAINLAND TO WRIGHTSVILLE BEACH

WHEREAS; the North Carolina Department of Transportation recently completed a renovation of the Heidi Trask Drawbridge (built in 1954) that included months of long lines of vehicles waiting to get onto and off of Wrightsville Beach; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Wrightsville Beach is concerned that regardless of how much we renovate the drawbridge, it is still sixty-two years old and the only way on and off of the island: and

WHEREAS, the Heidi Trask Drawbridge is the Town's lifeline and residents and businesses would be severely and adversely affected if anything were to happen to render the bridge unusable; and

WHEREAS, given the time it takes to plan and implement transportation projects, the Board of Aldermen is requesting that the North Carolina Department of Transportation and the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization begin to explore the feasibility of future alternatives for bridge access from the mainland to Wrightsville Beach; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen is also requesting that the future plan also look at short-term improvements that could be implemented to improve traffic flow prior to the construction of a new bridge or any further renovation to the existing bridge.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Wrightsville Beach, North Carolina hereby requests that the North Carolina Department of Transportation and the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization explore the feasibility of future alternatives for bridge access to Wrightsville Beach as well as short-term improvements that would improve traffic flow prior to the construction of a new bridge or further renovation to the existing bridge.

Wilmington Urban Area MPO's 2018 UPWP Call for Planning Studies/Projects

The Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) is a statement of work identifying the planning priorities and activities to be carried out by the Metropolitan Planning Organization. At a minimum, a UPWP must include a description of the planning work and resulting products, identify who will perform the work, the time frames for completing the work, the cost of the work, and the source(s) of funds. The Wilmington Urban Area MPO's UPWP provides the government officials, local member jurisdictions and general public with the anticipated expenditures of the MPO on an annual basis. Additionally, the UPWP outlines the planning studies and projects anticipated to be completed by the MPO.

The North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) has outlined the below schedule for adoption of 2018 UPWPs:

- January 31, 2017- Draft UPWPs for are due for FY 18
- March 31, 2017- Last day to submit adopted FY 18 UPWP
- June 30, 2017 TPB approves FY 18 UPWP

Based on the schedule provided by NCDOT, the Wilmington Urban Area MPO presents the following process for FY 18.

Call for Planning Projects/Studies-

The Wilmington Urban Area MPO's solicitation shall occur beginning on September 29th with submittals due to the MPO no later than 5 pm on November 15th. Responses shall include the name and description of the requested project/study, anticipated cost and any identified local funding contribution. Additionally, the MPO will also prepare a list of planning studies and projects it intends to pursue.

Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization

Drafting and Approving the UPWP-

Once the proposed studies/projects have been submitted, the Wilmington Urban Area MPO will review the proposed projects/studies and develop a draft UPWP. The UPWP will be reviewed and approved by the TCC and TAC prior to March 31, 2017.

Project Description

Roadway extending from the vicinity of US 17 Bypass and I-140 in Brunswick County to US 421 in New Hanover County, including a crossing of the Cape Fear River.

Current Status

The following list includes completed and ongoing tasks during the month of August:

- The project team continues to coordinate and correspond with project stakeholders.
- The Hurricane Evacuation Analysis Technical Memorandum has been finalized.
- The Historic Architecture Eligibility Report has been finalized. The project team will meet with the State Historic Preservation Office in the next few months to determine potential effects to these resources from the 12 Detailed Study Alternatives.
- Updates to the project website have been completed.
- Studies for the Traffic Noise Analysis and Air Quality Analysis are ongoing.
- An update to the Draft Natural Resources Technical Report is ongoing.
- The Draft Sea Level Rise Assessment is currently under review by NCDOT.
- An update to the Archaeological Predictive Model is ongoing.
- Right-of-Way cost estimates and relocation reports have been initiated.
- NCDOT is currently evaluating an additional alternative proposed by the WMPO near the Port of Wilmington. There are currently 12 alternatives being designed and evaluated for inclusion in the draft environmental document. NCDOT is coordinating with the NCSPA regarding this alternative; if it is determined this alternative is reasonable, studies may need to be redone to include this alternative.
- The Cape Fear Crossing project is programmed in the 2016-2025 STIP for planning and environmental studies only using STPDA funding from the Wilmington MPO.
- The project team will plan to present the status of the project to the WMPO TAC before the next NEPA/Section 404 Merger Team Meeting.

WILMINGTON MPO TRANSPORTATION PLANNING SEPTEMBER 2016

CONGESTION MANAGEMENT PROCESS

Project Description/Scope: Comply with a Federal mandate to create and adopt a process to evaluate the region's most congested corridors through locally-defined multi-modal performance measures in an effort to suggest improvements that would alleviate traffic congestion in the region. The CMP was adopted by the TAC on December 11, 2013. Data collection procedures have been developed. A schedule for collection logistics has been drafted and data collection will continuously be monitored and updated as needed. The Congestion Management Process Biennial Report was adopted on August 31, 2016.

Next Steps:

• Establish data collection schedule for 2016-2018

COLLEGE ROAD UPGRADES (U-5702), (U-5704) and (U-5792)

Project Description/Scope: The Strategic Transportation Investments is a new formula to determine how the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT), in partnership with local governments, will fund and prioritize transportation projects in the state of North Carolina. The Strategic Transportation Investment Formula allocates funding at the statewide, regional and division tiers. Prioritization 3.0 was the process used to determine the projects that are to be funded in the State's Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). The adopted 2016-2025 State Transportation Improvement Program includes several projects on College Road.

U-5704: Construction of an interchange at College Road and Oleander Drive

U-5702: Construction of Access Management Improvements on College Road between Gordon Road and Carolina Beach Road. The Department has several spot safety and intersection improvements that are anticipated would be completed under this project. This project may also include median modifications, access management strategies, etc. to improve traffic flow and safety on College Road. Another project that may be funded in the Statewide Mobility Category is an Upgrade of College Road between New Centre Drive and Gordon Road to include an additional through lane and an interchange at College Road and the Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway.

U-5792: Convert at-grade intersection to interchange

Next Steps:

• Complete Planning, Environmental Review and Design for the projects

MAYOR'S RAIL RE-ALIGNMENT TASK FORCE

The City of Wilmington has appointed a Mayor's Task Force to evaluate the feasibility of re-aligning the rail line that currently traverses the City of Wilmington and potentially re-purpose this rail line for another use. This project is jointly funded by the City of Wilmington, North Carolina Department of Transportation and Wilmington MPO. All three entities have agreed to participate financially in the study. The City contracted with Moffatt & Nichol to complete the study. A steering committee project kick-off meeting was held on July 15th. The consultant is currently evaluating potential rail alignments

and the socio-economic studies are underway. The consultant's first deliverable is the review of physical conditions which is due in September.

METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION PLAN

Project Description/Scope: Update the Federally-mandated Metropolitan Transportation Plan/Long-Range Transportation Plan for the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization. The plan was adopted by all Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization member jurisdictions and the WMPO Board. The MPO is developing the 2017-2021 Strategic Business Plan in an effort to implement the MTP.

Next Steps:

- Implementation of the plan
- Develop a Strategic Business Plan

MILITARY CUTOFF ROAD/EASTWOOD ROAD (U-5710)

Project Descriptions/Scope: The adopted 2016-2025 State Transportation Improvement Program identified funding to upgrade the intersection of Military Cutoff Road/Eastwood Road to an interchange. HDR has been selected by NCDOT to complete this work. The Department is evaluating several alternatives to include a single point urban interchange, at-grade quadrant, continuous flow intersection, etc.

Next Steps:

• Complete Planning, Environmental Review and Design for the project

<u>17[™] STREET STREETSCAPE</u>

Project Descriptions/Scope: The 17th Street streetscape project will include upgrades to 17th Street between Wrightsville Avenue and Princess Place Drive. The project will provide for a more efficient transportation system by reduced travel speeds, removal of the lateral shift, improved pedestrian crossings, improved safety and enhance the aesthetics of the area. The project may also include aesthetic improvements that will enhance the entryway into Carolina Heights and provide a pocket park. The project had a bid opening on March 3rd. The City awarded the construction contract to Lanier Construction on June 21st. Construction began on August 22nd. Construction is anticipated to last 9 months.

• Complete construction of the improvements

U-5534B - CITY OF WILMINGTON- HEIDI TRASK DRAWBRIDGE

Project Descriptions/Scope: This project consists of construction of a public walkway/pier underneath the Heidi Trask Drawbridge to provide for a safe crossing for cyclists and pedestrians across US 74 (Wrightsville Avenue) on the mainland side of the drawbridge in Wilmington.

Next Steps:

- Construction contract awarded to Intercoastal Marine, LLC
- Earthwork and demo work underway
- Helical pile designs need to be submitted for review and piles ordered

U-5534C - WRIGHTSVILLE AVENUE/GREENVILLE AVENUE TO HINTON AVENUE

Project Descriptions/Scope: The project is for construction of intersection re-alignment improvements at the intersection of Wrightsville Avenue/Greenville Avenue and bike lanes and sidewalks along Greenville Avenue from Wrightsville Avenue to Hinton Avenue.

Next Steps:

- Design plans are complete
- Right of Way is almost complete

U-5534D - TOWN OF LELAND - OLD FAYETTEVILLE ROAD MUP

Project Descriptions/Scope: This project is for design and construction of a ten foot (10') wide multi use path, separate but adjacent to Old Fayetteville Road, beginning at or around the corner of the Leland Town Hall Campus and ending at the driveway of the North Brunswick High School.

Next Steps:

The Town desires to combine the project with the awarded 2014 STP-DA project.

- **1.** Bus fleet replacement & conversion to CNG (no change) identifying state and federal funding opportunities to replace 19 thirty-five foot buses. Bid awarded to Gillig, LLC on June 26, 2014. The Authority continues to seek federal funding for replacement buses.
- 2. Wilmington Multimodal Transportation Center Interlocal Agreement between Authority, City of Wilmington, WMPO and NCDOT finalized. Demolition of Haul building has been completed. The Authority is working to complete NEPA Document, stabilize Neuwirth Brothers and Thomas Grocery buildings, and design and construct transit portion of WMMTC. A contract with John Davenport Engineering for the NEPA document was approved on June 23, 2016. The draft NEPA Document is complete and undergoing final preparations for FTA approval. The building stabilization IFB is nearing completion. The Design and Engineering RFQ is complete. Transfer of the property is currently underway. Design and stabilization are contingent on property transfer. Construction is expected to be complete in December 2017.
- 3. Short Range Transportation Plan (no significant change) following adoption of Cape Fear Transportation 2040 by the Wilmington Metropolitan Planning Organization (WMPO), Wave Transit is preparing to begin its latest short range plan. The plan will set a course for public transportation initiatives, route structure and revenue programming for the next five years. The plan will also include a financial element to ensure that transit programs are compliant with FTA rules and regulations. Under the direction of the Authority's Operations and Planning Committee made up of Board members, staff, WMPO planners, passengers, interested citizens, and professional transit planning consultants, the 12-18 month plan is an important tool in meeting the public transportation needs of the community. Marketing, public relations and community support for financing transit in Southeastern North Carolina will also be a focus of the plan. A key component of the plan will be extensive surveying to assess the needs of current and prospective passengers.
- **4.** Long Term Funding (no change) currently, the Authority does not have a dedicated source of local funding. An initiative to analyze long term revenue stability of Wave Transit has also been proposed by the City of Wilmington. This effort is critical to the long term financial health of the Authority. No timetable for the analysis has been developed.
- 5. Shelter Program a program to replace and add up to 50 bus shelters and 25 benches at bus stops is nearing construction. A contract to install five shelters was awarded to Paragon Building Corp. on May 26, 2016. Construction of the first five shelters is complete. Phase two consisting of 12 shelters and 15 benches is expected to begin in October. Phase three consisting of three super stops at Independence Mall, Hanover Center and Monkey Junction is in the engineering and permitting phase.
