1. Call to Order

Ms. Padgett called the meeting to order at 3:32pm.

2. Conflict of Interest Reminder

Ms. Padgett asked if any members had a conflict of interest with any items on the meeting agenda. No members reported having a conflict of interest.

3. Approval of Minutes

The minutes for the April 30th meeting were approved unanimously.

4. Public Comment Period

No one requested to speak during the Public Comment Period.

5. Consent Agenda

- a. Opening of the 30-day public comment period for STIP/MTIP Amendments
- b. Resolution adopting STP-DA Project Submittal Guide
- c. Resolution adopting TAP-DA Project Submittal Guide
- d. Resolution adopting an amendment to the 2014-2015 UPWP

Ms. Batleman pulled Item b (Resolution adopting STP-DA Project Submittal Guide) and Item c (Resolution adopting TAP-DA Project Submittal Guide) for further consideration.

Dr. Sheridan made the motion to approve the consent agenda excluding Items b and c. Ms. Batleman seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Ms. Batleman stated that she pulled items b and c for informational reasons. She asked if under eligibility criteria when talking about the co-applicant process, does one of the applicants become the principal applicant and the other the secondary applicant. Is the primary applicant the leader of that particular project and is that determined by population? Ms. Harrington said the primary applicant is not necessarily the municipality with the largest population. They are asking that the project have a primary contact person. Ms. Harrington added that if members are submitting a co-application, both municipalities will need to submit a resolution of support for the project. Ms. Batleman asked if the primary applicant is responsible for the record keeping. Mr. Knight said the Federal Government requires that both municipalities to keep records and both will have equal responsibilities.

Ms. Batleman made the motion to adopt Item b (Resolution adopting STP-DA Project Submittal Guide) and Item c (Resolution adopting TAP-DA Project Submittal Guide). Mr. Doetsch seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

6. New Business

a. Resolution rescinding the request for the Wilmington MPO to the federal designated recipient of Section 5310 funds

Ms. Rashid told members that at the March 26th meeting, the TAC approved a resolution to appoint the Wilmington MPO as the designated recipient of Section 5310 funds. She stated that following additional discussion with the NCDOT Public Transportation Division, FTA and other MPOs, staff was made aware that other MPOs have their local transit authority be the designated recipient for the funds. She told members that staff proposed to divide the responsibilities so that the MPO would manage the decisions regarding how the funds are allocated. Ms. Rashid said that because the Cape Fear Public Transportation Authority (CFPTA) already handles the financial management of FTA funding, staff recommended that they be the designated recipient of the funds.

Ms Rashid told members that the proposed changes went to the CFPTA Board at their May 22nd meeting and they passed a resolution requesting to become the designated recipient. Mr. Kozlosky noted that the next step will be to develop a process to administer these funds. Staff will bring that back to the TAC for approval.

Mr. Breault made the motion to rescind the request for the Wilmington MPO to the federal designated recipient of Section 5310 funds. Mr. Miller seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

b. <u>Resolution supporting the Cape Fear Public Transportation Authority be the federal designated</u> recipient of Section 5310 funds

Ms. Batleman made the motion to support Cape Fear Public Transportation Authority becoming the federal designated recipient of Section 5310 funds. Mr. Doetsch seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

c. Reschedule September 24th TAC Meeting Date

Ms. Padgett made the motion to reschedule the September 24th meeting to September 17th at 3:30pm. Mr. Breault seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

7. Discussion

a. NCDOT response regarding the removal of certain routes within the Wilmington region from the North Carolina truck network with reasonable access routes designation

Mr. Kozlosky told members the request to remove certain routes within the Wilmington region from the NC truck network was denied by NCDOT. They indicated that they are willing to consider removing

the designation on Oleander Drive from Military Cutoff to College Road, as well as on Carolina Beach Road south of the Port if the TAC desires; however, all other requests were denied. Mr. Kozlosky noted that there is an appeal process to the Secretary of Transportation if the MPO desires.

Mr. Kozlosky told members that the MPO staff heard concerns expressed from the trucking industry, as well as from the Port. Ms. Padgett noted that it was not intended to limit access to the Port but to direct the access away from the busiest parts of the City.

Mr. Doetsch suggested tabling further action until TAC members have the opportunity to discuss the removal of the designation and perhaps invite some of the trucking companies to provide input before moving forward.

Mr. Doetsch made the motion to table further action regarding NCDOT's response regarding the removal of certain routes within the Wilmington region from the North Carolina truck network with reasonable access routes designation. Mr. Lambeth seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

b. Strategic Transportation Investment Formula

Mr. Kozlosky told members that on May 18th the NCDOT released their scores for the highway and non-highway projects. Staff is working through the local prioritization process. Part of the local preference score includes resolutions adopted by each of the local jurisdictions acknowledging local support. Staff is requesting that the each of the jurisdictions submit those resolutions of support by June 20th. That will allow staff time to prepare the draft results for presentation to TAC members at the June 25th meeting. He said staff would also request members schedule a meeting for the month of July to approve the draft rankings and begin the public input process. Final adoption will be held at the August meeting. Final scores must be submitted to NCDOT by August 29th. Mr. Kozlosky reminded members that all modes of transportation will compete against all modes for points.

Ms. Padgett told members that this is probably the most important task the TAC will accomplish this year and it is what drives the transportation into the future. She asked members to make a point of reviewing the list of projects and decide their importance so that members send the message that works for the region.

c. Strategic Transportation Corridors

Mr. Kozlosky told members that NCDOT is in the process of updating their Strategic Transportation Corridors. The Department has rated and ranked each of the strategic corridors. The scores were based on system connectivity, mobility and economic prosperity. Mr. Kozlosky stated that the Department is accepting comments and staff has prepared some initial comments. He noted that the comment form was included in the packet and staff will bring the list of comments along with a resolution to the June meeting.

d. Statewide Rail Plan

Mr. Kozlosky told members that the Statewide Rail Plan Survey is included in the packet. The survey will allow members to comment on the State Rail Plan. The public comment survey is due back to the Department by June 15th. They are also accepting additional project submittals.

Ms. Padgett noted that during presentations on alternative transportation held at the NCAMPO Conference earlier in the month, it was abundantly clear that southeastern North Carolina has no projects in the Statewide Rail Plan.

e. Shipyard Boulevard Sidewalk Project

Mr. Kozlosky told members that the Port requested that a sidewalk be constructed from Carolina Beach Road down to WECT. The project will also include bus pull-outs. The Cape Fear Public Transportation Authority identified funds from their 2013 STP-DA allocation. The local match will come from the City of Wilmington's bicycle and pedestrian improvement program. Staff is working to develop a cost estimate for the project. Once the cost estimate is complete, staff will move forward with a STIP/MTIP amendment to identify the project. The design work will be done in-house by MPO staff.

8. Updates

Project updates for the Crossing over the Cape Fear River Work Group, Wilmington MPO, CFPTA and NCDOT Division and Planning Branch are included in the agenda packet.

Other Items:

- a. Mr. Barfield told members it was brought to his attention that NCDOT is surveying the cemetery at Mt. Ararat Church. The Department held a meeting with the church regarding the cemetery. He noted that he has family members buried in the cemetery. He and his family were not informed that a meeting was taking place.
 - Ms. Fussell stated that the Department is concerned because the construction limits on the original project were getting too close to the cemetery. They are using ground penetrating radar to survey the area in an effort to verify if there is any possibility of un-marked graves. The Department is waiting on the survey results and that information will be shared with the church and any other interested parties.
- **b.** Mr. Kozlosky asked if TAC members would consider the scheduling of a meeting for the month of July to approve the draft rankings and begin the public input process for the STI.

Ms Padgett made the motion to schedule a July 23rd to the meeting at 3:30pm. Mr. Miller seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

9. Adjournment

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 4:27 PM

FY 2014-2015 UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM for the WILMINGTON, NORTH CAROLINA URBAN AREA

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Introduction

In compliance with Federal law and in the spirit of cooperation, the Wilmington Urban Area conducts a "cooperative, comprehensive, and continuing...." transportation planning process. This Planning Work Program (PWP) outlines the tasks and associated funding sources dedicated to the Wilmington Urban Area MPO transportation planning process during fiscal year 2014-2015. Depending on the specific funding source, tasks funded through the PWP are eligible for reimbursement of 80-90% of their cost from the Federal Highway Administration and Federal Transit Administration through the North Carolina Department of Transportation.

The PWP for the Wilmington Urban Area identifies four separate funding sources for Urban Area transportation planning. A brief description of these funding sources follows:

- -Statewide Planning and Research Programs (SPR)-These funds are used by NCDOT to conduct work for the Wilmington Urban Area MPO.
- -Federal Highway Administration Section 104(f) Funds-These funds are dedicated to the urban area to perform transportation planning. They require a 20% local match.
- -Federal Transit Administration Section 5303 Funds-These funds are used for transit planning in the urban area. The Federal Transit Administration provides 80% of these funds, NCDOT 10%, and there is a required 10% local match.
- -Surface Transportation Program-Direct Attributable Funds- These funds are dedicated to Transportation Management Areas and these funds can be used to perform transportation planning. They require a 20% local match.

The local match requirements will be shared by all members of the Wilmington Urban Area MPO in direct proportion to population as defined in the Wilmington Urban Area MPO Memorandum of Understanding.

<u>II-A6 Dwelling Unit, Population, Employment Changes</u>- Will measure land use changes by Transportation Analysis Zone between 2010 Census and travel demand model base year. Staff will provide capacity analysis for proposed developments within the Wilmington planning area boundary.

II-A7 Air Travel- Assistance to Wilmington International Airport as needed.

II-A8 Vehicle Occupancy Rate Counts- Monitor VOC as needed.

<u>II-A9 Travel Time Studies-</u> Conduct key travel time studies for travel demand model and development of the Long Range Transportation Plan.

<u>II-A10 Mapping</u>- Keep Geographic Information System files current and produce maps to support the TCC and TAC, transportation plans, programs, and projects.

II-A11 Central Area Parking Inventory- No tasks foreseen.

<u>II-A12 Bicycle and Pedestrian Facilities Inventory</u>- Update ride suitability assessment of federal-aid functionally classed roadways.

<u>II-B1 Collection of Base Year Data</u>- No tasks foreseen.

II-B2 Collection of Network Data- No tasks foreseen.

II-B3 Travel Model Updates- No tasks foreseen.

II-B4 Travel Surveys- No tasks foreseen.

- <u>II-B16 Financial Planning</u>- Develop realistic, best estimates of funding sources available and project cost estimates throughout the forecast years for the MTP. Ensure fiscal constraint in the update of the MTP.

- <u>II-B17 Congestion Management Strategies</u>- Develop strategies to address and manage congestion by increasing transportation system supply, reducing demand by application of alternative mode solutions, and transportation system management strategies. Evaluate strategies developed for the Congestion Management Process. Document process and solutions in the update of the MTP.



WHEREAS, the North Carolina Department of Transportation is developing the North Carolina Transportation Network (NCTN) and draft recommended Strategic Transportation Corridors (STC); and

WHEREAS, NCDOT encourages the submission of comments on the proposed STC vision, goals, elements and proposed corridors; and

WHEREAS, comments will be accepted by NCDOT until Friday, June 27, 2014; and

WHEREAS, the Wilmington MPO has reviewed the North Carolina Transportation Network (NCTN) and draft recommended Strategic Transportation Corridors (STC) and provides the following comments:

- The Wilmington MPO's TAC adopted a resolution requesting NCDOT add NC 133 to the Strategic Highway Corridors due to the location and importance. This route is not identified on the draft plan.
- The Wilmington MPO adopted a resolution requesting US 421 between Wilmington and Dunn be added as a Strategic Highway Corridor due to its location and importance. The alignment on the proposed map does not depict the alignment supported by the MPO.
- Military facilities should be included on the Stratified map.
- There have been discussions regarding the removal of Corridor H in Brunswick County that traverses the Green Swamp. The Wilmington MPO requests removal of this alignment and supports the I-74 connection to I-140 (Wilmington Bypass).
- Since the NCTN and STC will serve as a planning tool that will undoubtedly be used in the future for any number of purposes, it is absolutely critical that future/unconstructed facilities are evaluated and considered as part of this network especially future funded facilities.
- Strategic Highway Corridor designation is utilized as a justification for NEPA. By removing new locations could have an impact on the development of Purpose and Needs statements for NEPA.
- If the process is revised to include future facilities the Wilmington MPO recommends that in the Wilmington area I-140, I-74 (current US74 upgraded to interstate standards), Independence Boulevard Extension, and the Hampstead Bypass be included in the SHCs.
- The Wilmington MPO recommends that the STRAHNET connectors should be included such as US117/Shipyard Boulevard and North 23rd Street which both lead to major nodes (an international airport and NC's largest port).
- Although "multimodal" is mentioned it appears that only motorized vehicle and freight traffic (to include rail) are being considered. It should be noted that only highways and rail are under consideration with this effort.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Wilmington Metropolitan Planning Organization's Transportation Advisory Committee hereby provides the aforementioned comments to NCDOT regarding the North Carolina Transportation Network (NCTN) and draft recommended Strategic Transportation Corridors (STC).

WILMINGTON MPO TRANSPORTATION PLANNING JUNE 2014

CROSSING OVER THE CAPE FEAR RIVER

Project Description/Scope: Construct a new crossing over the Cape Fear River that will link from in the vicinity of US 17 to Independence Boulevard and Carolina Beach Road. On January 30, 2013 the Wilmington MPO's TAC formally created a work group to assist in the development of the project.

Next Steps:

- The work group met on May 29th. The work group discussed the current and upcoming tasks, Strategic Transportation Investments formula, Strategic Highway Corridors initiative, the vessel survey and the detailed study alternatives.
- The NCDOT continues to work through the environmental review process. The Record of Decision is expected in 2017.

CONGESTION MANAGEMENT PROCESS

Project Description/Scope: Comply with a Federal mandate to create and adopt a process to evaluate the region's most congested corridors through locally-defined multi-modal performance measures in an effort to suggest improvements that would alleviate traffic congestion in the region. The CMP was adopted by the TAC on December 11, 2013. Data collection procedures and logistics continue to be developed.

Next Steps:

Begin data collection and monitoring of congestion

METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION PLAN

Project Description/Scope: Update the Federally-mandated Metropolitan Transportation Plan/Long-Range Transportation Plan for the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization. Project data was gathered and processed in March 2014. Fiscal analysis data collection commenced in March 2014. Modal subcommittees initiated project recommendations in April 2014.

Next Steps:

- WMPO Travel Demand Model continues development through June 2014
- Modal Subcommittees to develop initial project recommendations through July 2014

17TH STREET STREETSCAPE

Project Descriptions/Scope: The 17th Street streetscape project will include upgrades to 17th Street between Wrightsville Avenue and Princess Place Drive. The project will provide for a more efficient transportation system by reduced travel speeds, removal of the lateral shift, improved pedestrian crossings, improved safety and enhance the aesthetics of the area. The project may also include aesthetic improvements that will enhance the entryway into Carolina Heights and provide a pocket park.

Next Steps:

• The City Engineering Department is continuing to work through the design and coordination with NCDOT. The City continues to develop the design plans.


