January 15, 2015 WMPO Bike/Ped Committee Meeting Minutes

- 1) Approval of Minutes motion by A. Schroetel, second by S. Whitney, approved unanimously
- 2) Old Business
 - a. Update Crossing the Cape Fear planning for bicycle and pedestrian facilities A. Harrington referred to the graphic "WMPO Role in Transportation Project Delivery: From Planning to Construction" to update the committee regarding the opportunity for bicycle and pedestrian facilities on the future Cape Fear River crossing. Harrington informed the group that the "skyway" bridge was not a fiscally constrained project in Cape Fear Commutes 2035. It was noted in the roadway chapter, but assumed to be a Turnpike Authority project. A bridge for crossing the Cape Fear was submitted in the prioritization process, but did not move forward to the STIP. However, in the database of prioritization projects, the description does include bicycle and pedestrian facilities. P. Riddle also confirmed that bicycle and pedestrian options are on the table. He said he participates in the Crossing the Cape Fear meetings, and currently there are 12 alignment options that are currently being explored. He also explained the depth of the merger process including archaeological and environmental investigations (among others) that take a very long time. He suggested the committee view the Surf City bridge video. S. Whitney stated this was a very important project for bicycle and pedestrian connections between Brunswick and New Hanover Counties. A. Harrington agreed to keep the committee posted regarding an appropriate time to pass a resolution supporting bicycle and pedestrian facilities on the proposed bridge.

3) New Business

 a. City of Wilmington Comprehensive Plan – Incorporation of Bicycle and Pedestrian Components – C. Hughes, Senior Planner for the City of Wilmington gave an overview of how bicycle and pedestrian components are being incorporated into the City's

Comprehensive Plan. She informed the committee that the City is nearing the end of the process for the development of the plan. They have conducted an extensive public outreach process contacting over 1,000 people in the City of Wilmington. She provided a handout (see attached) of the top 15 priorities identified from the public input process, highlighting #1 as bicycle and pedestrian facilities, and #2 as traffic congestion. When looking at the number of responses regarding these top 2 of 15 priorities, there were a significantly larger number of responses regarding these 2 priorities than other priorities. The plan includes 11 chapters of policies and a series of maps. One in particular is the identification of "priority pedestrian streets". These maps will be out for public review March 4th from 3:00 – 5:00 at the Northeast Library on Military Cutoff Road. The policy chapters will be available online in about a month. C. Hughes did confirm that they are collaborating with the county throughout the development of this plan and with the coordination of place types. A. Harrington asked about how to access these maps online. C. Hughes informed the committee that these maps would be interactive – input can be provided and you can 'like' someone else's comments to show additional support. D. McDonnell informed the committee that New Hanover County's maps are not at the level of detail as the City's. Their 1st meeting is January 26th at the Executive Development Center and their schedule is available online.

b. Draft STIP Bicycle and Pedestrian Projects – A. Harrington provided the committee with an update on the draft STIP projects (see attached presentation for a list of bike/ped projects). The STIP is a 10 year planning program. A. Harrington explained that the first 5 years programmed are "safe" – much less likely for anything to change. She referred to the graphic "WMPO Role in Transportation Project Delivery: From Planning to Construction" to identify where the STIP is in the planning to construction process. Although there are "only" 5 projects listed in the Bike/Ped chapter, considering the limited amount of funding for bike/ped facilities, the WMPO considers this to be a considerable amount of projects. Also, projects listed in the roadways section could potentially include bike/ped facilities. A. Harrington explained that this is another example of how "getting in ahead of time" to include bike/ped projects in roadway project scope and design is important – this topic has been discussed at previous WMPO Bike/Ped meetings. A. Harrington will send out a link to the draft STIP. B. Paris asked about the rail corridor between McRae Street and 3rd street being converted to a trail/greenspace. A. Harrington said she would send out an update on that project.

4) Other Discussion


a. WMPO Bike Map Design and Print Funding – A. Harrington gave an overview of regional bike map design/printing needs and funds (see attached presentation). Currently, there is \$1,135 in the WMPO Bike/Ped account. In the past these funds have been used to purchase materials for the annual River to Sea Bike Ride event, then replenished with the profits from selling event t-shirts. With the event being planned and hosted by the WMPO, City of Wilmington, New Hanover County, and Wrightsville Beach, and the River to Sea Bike Route being a designated WMPO bike route (route #1), A. Harrington proposed using a large portion of the funds to print River to Sea Bikeway maps. She acknowledged the need to keep enough money in the account to be able to purchase t-shirts for the 2015 bike ride. The River to Sea Bikeway maps will cost an estimated

\$1,000 to print 5,000 copies. A. Harrington suggested using approximately \$700 of the \$1,135 towards printing the maps. The committee agreed to spend approximately this amount. A. Harrington said she would include this information in an email to the committee before spending those funds, to ensure everyone is onboard. A. Harrington also gave a quick update about the WMPO Bike Suitability Map. Design will likely be funded by the WMPO, and UNCW's College of Health and Human Services (CHHS) will print approximately 7,000 copies. CHHS will also print the Cross-City Trail maps. B. Paris asked if the Bike Suitability Map sub-committee could work with the designer to label the unknown neighborhood streets, explaining that many people know where the major roadways are located, but can have a hard time finding the recommended streets with labeling the streets nearby. The adjacent streets are useful as a point of reference. K. Mills asked if there would be an option for printing smaller maps, set up similar to the tiled, old zoning maps.

- b. WMPO Bike/Ped Committee 2015 Calendar A. Harrington presented a proposed calendar for the 2015 WMPO Bike/Ped Committee meetings. The committee agreed to move forward with scheduling the proposed dates. A. Harrington will modify the dates to include time and location of the meeting and send out to the committee (see attached).
- c. WMPO Bike/ped Official Voting Members Update A. Harrington provided a handout (see attached) showing the vacant seats on the WMPO Bike/Ped Committee. She will be following up with the appropriate individuals to get these seats officially filled.
- d. Other discussion
 - i. B. Paris mentioned the City of Wilmington's Bicycle Friendly Community designation re-application. She suggested Mike Bassano as an additional person who would be of assistance with the application.
 - ii. A. Schroetel provided an update for the Terry Benji Bicycle Foundation. Bylaws are established, a board of directors is set up, and it has been designated a 501(c)3.
 - iii. B. Paris provided an update regarding the East Coast Greenway designation along the Gary Shell Cross-City Trail. At the ECG meeting in November, the committee officially designated the portion along Randall Parkway, the Shipyard and Independence Blvd intersection portion, and along the eastern boarder of UNCW, including Riegel Rd, Hurst Dr., and Rose Ave. However, the portion of the trail along Mallard St. and Rill Rd. are not and will not be designated as part of the ECG because the existing facility (bike lanes and sidewalks) are not compatible with ECG's facility requirements of a multi-use path/greenway.
