1) Call to Order

Vice Chairman Luke Waddell called the meeting to order at 3:01 p.m. MPO Executive Director Mike Kozlosky called the roll, and a quorum was present as follows:

2) <u>Conflict of Interest statement and recusals</u> Vice Chairman Waddell read the conflict of interest statement for t

Vice Chairman Waddell read the conflict-of-interest statement for the board.

3) Approval of Board Member Excused Absences

Mr. Kozlosky requested a motion to excuse Wendy Fletcher-Hardee, John Ellen, and Chairman Hank Miller from the meeting.

Mr. Barbee made a motion to excuse Wendy Fletcher-Hardee, Chairman Hank Miller and John Ellen from the meeting and Ms. Bozeman seconded. Motion passes unanimously.

4) Approval of the Agenda

Mr. Forte made a motion to approve the agenda. Mr. Barfield seconded. Motion passes unanimously.

Public Comment Period

No public sign ups.

6) Presentations

a. <u>FHWA Federal Funds and August Redistribution, David Wasserman, and Ben Johnson, NCDOT</u> <u>STIP Unit</u>

Ben Johnson, P.E., and David Wasserman, P.E., from North Carolina Department of Transportation's (NCDOT) State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) unit gave an overview of federal. funding and fund swaps and the benefits and challenges involved. Mr. Johnson stated that one of the challenges is in mid 1990s, NCDOT agreed to allow Transportation Management Areas (TMA) to direct how Surface Transportation Block Grant Program-Direct Attributable (STBG-DA) funds should be spent. Mr. Johnson said this gave local jurisdictions more options with local projects but slowed down the delivery of federally funded projects due to complex federal rules. In turn, this has led to delays with NCDOT being able to obligate STBG-DA funds each year which leads to large unobligated balances and limits the amount to be requested going forward. Mr. Johnson noted different ways NCDOT can lose federal funds. He noted the first was with a lapse. He explained that funds must be obligated by the end of the 4th year. He stated that the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) modified transfer rules for Transportation Alternative Programs (TAP), making it difficult to transfer. Mr. Johnson also stated that rescissions enacted by Congress can impact on the loss of funds. He gave a brief breakdown of how and where federal funding is dispersed and the obligation authority. He explained what August redistribution is and the process for receiving funds. He noted that high awards over the last several years overdue to high unobligated balances and the numerous STBG-DA swaps performed. Mr. Johnson discussed preparing for the redistribution and fund swaps and how they work. He explained the proposal for future August redistribution and examples of the plan to disburse funds and from what sources. Mr. Wasserman then gave an overview of the state's DA funding proposal moving forward. He noted that NCDOT is proposing the following for TMAs to receive direct attributable funding. He stated that each year (or upon request) NCDOT will provide each MPO how much federal funds could possibly be available. Then the MPO will notify NCDOT of a list of projects to fund with desired schedules. At that time NCDOT will review each project for funding eligibility and use the most appropriate/restrictive fund source first. NCDOT will then work collaboratively with the MPO to manage project funding and may switch funding sources as needed for August Redistribution. Mr. Wasserman also stated that NCDOT strongly encourages MPO's to have a single call for all types of projects as this provides the funding flexibility needed. He explained this approach allows NCDOT to maximize best funding practices.

Mike Koslosky stated that he asked Mr. Johnson and Mr. Wasserman to come present to the board to help with understanding fund swaps, highlight the \$265 million dollars received this year, and to explain the proposal that will be brought back before the Board at a later date for consideration.

Mr. Anderson asked if the \$265 million has been allocated already or what is it going to be spent on.

Mr. Wasserman explained that essentially that money goes towards projects already under construction that potentially next year's funds were going towards. It is dispersed across the state.

Mr. Barbee stated that his understanding of the presentation was that the real benefit and real objective is not to lose federal funding. Mr. Wasserman stated that yes that is right, but it is also to maximize the amount of funds.

Mr. Forte asked if money is distributed based on future growth of population? Mr. Wasserman stated that federal dollars are prescribed in federal law, so it's basically based on percentages. Each state gets a certain percentage then the state allocates that money to each of the MPO's with over 200,000 in population then it is subdivided between remaining MPO's across the state.

b. Get There Greener, Carolyn Caggia, WMPO

Carolyn Caggia, WMPO presented the Get There Greener commuter challenge that will start in October. She gave a brief history of the commuter challenges through 2022 and previous prizes associated with the challenges. She explained some changes have been made include a branding change that incorporates feedback about commuting versus daily transportation needs for various populations including retirees, stay-at-home parents, and others. It also returns to the sustainability roots of the challenge by tracking greenhouse gas savings calculated from miles traveled by mode. In addition, the challenge is now a month long. Ms. Caggia gave an overview of how to participate and the website link. She then reviewed with the group the next steps which includes gathering prizes and promoting the challenge.

a. <u>Resolution approving amendments to the Go Coast Bylaws</u>. Carolyn Caggia, WMPO gave a brief overview of the changes made to the bylaws. Ms. Bozeman made a motion to approve Go Coast bylaws. Mr. Barbee seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

9) Discussion

a. 2020-2029 STIP/MPO Transportation Improvement Program Administrative Modifications #23-1

Mr. Kozlosky said that this item is for information purposes only and will be brought back for consideration at the Board's next meeting.

10) Updates

a. Wilmington Urban Area MPO

Mr. Kozlosky presented the annual reports to the Board for their review and stated that staff will be presenting the reports to each member jurisdiction.

b. Cape Fear Public Transportation Authority

Mark Hairr, Cape Fear Public Transit Authority, introduced himself to the Board and gave a brief background on his experience. He said that workshops have started to work on a formal short-range plan for the system and would welcome any input that the Board would like to provide.

c. NCDOT Division

Chad Kimes, NCDOT spoke about the ribbon cutting for Military Cutoff Road extension. He gave the Board instructions on how to get to the ribbon cutting and just how happy and excited the NCDOT and this area is that this project is complete.

d. NCDOT Transportation Planning Division

Nadia Sader, NCDOT, stated they will be starting the Pender County Comprehensive Transportation Plan this fall, otherwise the Wilmington Travel demand model and the Brunswick County CIP are ongoing and on track.

11) Announcements

a. Brunswick County Heritage Ride

Mr. Kozlosky announced that the Brunswick County Heritage Ride is this weekend and that it had reached capacity but there will be same day sign ups available.

b. 2050 MTP Outreach

Mr. Kozlosky played the Outreach video for the Board which was very well received. He thanked staff for all their work on the video. He then introduced Vanessa Lacer to give a brief update on the outreach. Ms. Lacer stated that they had a fruitful first month, phase one public outreach period for the Metropolitan Transportation Plan. They conducted five public meetings and launched a survey which is hovering around 1,508 responses. She stated the last time this planning process was done they had a total of 2,000 responses so they are on their way in the first month of public participation. This will continue through November and the survey will be open. She concluded by stating that outreach will continue through November and at festivals and pop-up events.

Next meeting – October 25th, 2023

There being no further business, Mr. Forte made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Ms. Bozeman, and the motion was carried unanimously.

The meeting adjourned at 3:57 p.m.

III-D-3 Special Studies: Consultant - MTP Development

Based on anticipated expenditures, the line item increased by \$5,400

When preparing the FY24 UPWP, staff estimated that the cost would be \$70,000 for a consultant to provide a financial forecast for the 2050 MTP. Staff selected Kimley Horn, an approved on-call consultant, to perform the task of identifying appropriate revenue sources, seeking out innovative funding techniques, and preparing cost estimates for potential 2025 - 2050 MTP projects. Estimates include the following modes of transportation: Aviation, Bicycle & Pedestrian, Ferry & Water Transportation, Rail, Public Transportation, and Roadway. Based on Kimley Horn's estimate of \$75,371, this line item increased by \$5,400.

III-D-3 Special Studies: Consultant - Organizational Analysis Phase 2

Based on anticipated expenditures, the line item decreased by \$5,400

Due to a decrease in scope for the Organization Analysis Phase 2, staff recommends moving funds from this study to the MTP Development. This fund shift will offset the increased MTP Development consultant cost; yielding a \$0 change in the UPWP budgeted totals.

Introduction

In compliance with Federal law and in the spirit of cooperation, the Wilmington Urban Area conducts a "cooperative, comprehensive, and continuing....." transportation planning process. This Planning Work Program (PWP) outlines the tasks and associated funding sources dedicated to the Wilmington Urban Area MPO transportation planning process during fiscal year 2024. Depending on the specific funding source, tasks funded through the PWP are eligible for reimbursement of 80-90% of their cost from the Federal Highway Administration and Federal Transit Administration through the North Carolina Department of Transportation.

The PWP for the Wilmington Urban Area identifies five separate funding sources for UrbanArea transportation planning. A brief description of these funding sources follows:

- Federal Highway Administration Section 104(f) Funds (PL104)
 Funds dedicated to the urban area to perform transportation planning. PL104 funds require a 20% local match.
- Federal Highway Administration
 Safe & Accessible Transportation Options Set Aside (SATO/Y410)
 These funds are dedicated b the urban area to perform transportation planning to increase safe and accessible options for multiple travel modes for people of all ages and abilities. SATO/Y410 funds require a 20% local match.
- Federal Highway Administration
 Surface Transportation Block Grant-Direct Attributable Funds (STBG-DA)
 Funds dedicated to Transportation Management Areas and these funds can be used to perform transportation planning. STBG-DA funds require a 20% local match.
- Federal Highway Administration Safe Streets for All (SS4A) These are discretionary grant funds b be used for the development of a multi-modal, accessible safety plan for the WMPO planning area. SS4A funds require a 20% local match. The WMPO plans to apply for these funds with the next call for projects.
- Federal Transit Administration Section 5303 Funds
 These funds are used for transit planning in the urban area. The Federal Transit Administration provides 80% of these funds, NCDOT 10%, and there is a required 10% local match.

The local match requirements will be shared by all members of the Wilmington Urban Area MPO in direct proportion to population as defined in the Wilmington Urban Area MPO Memorandum of Understanding

It is expected that re-projection of travel patterns, including transit, would require a re-tabulation of these factors used in developing the travel models. A GIS database may be used to maintain housing and land use information. The MPO will normally be responsible for providing socioeconomic data in spreadsheet form to NCDOT Transportation Planning Division.

<u>II-B-2 Collection of Network Data</u> - Collection of the following variables describing the existing street system is necessary to build a base network for the travel model: 1) posted speed limit; 2) width/lanes; 3) segment length; 4) traffic signal locations. These items are generally the standard parameters required, but others may be needed as models become more sophisticated. The network development process is included in this task item.

<u>II-B-3 Travel Model Updates</u> - In concert with the North Carolina Department of Transportation, MPO staff will assist in the development of the 2050 travel demand model. Tasks to include assistance with trip generation and review of trip distribution, modal split, and trip assignment.

<u>II-B-9 Highway Element of the LRTP</u> - Identification of highway deficiencies, priorities, and proposed highway improvement solutions and strategies. Provide documentation of process and recommendations in the MTP. Implementation of the Performance Measures from the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act.

<u>II-B-10</u> Transit Element of Metropolitan Transportation Plan - Identify public transportation deficiencies, priorities, and proposed transit improvement solutions for inclusion in the update of the MTP. Provide documentation of process and recommendations in the updateof the MTP. Implementation of the Performance Measures from the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act.

<u>II-B-11 Bicycle and Pedestrian Element of the Metropolitan Transportation Plan</u> - Identify bicycle deficiencies, priorities, and proposed bicycle and pedestrian improvement solutionsand strategies. Provide documentation of the process and recommendations in the update of the MTP. Implementation of the Performance Measures from the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act.

<u>II-B-12 Airport/Air Travel Element of the Metropolitan Transportation Plan</u> - Identify airportand air service deficiencies, priorities, and proposed airport and air service improvement solutions and strategies. Provide documentation of process and recommendations in the update of the MTP.

II-B-13 Collector Street Element of Metropolitan Transportation Plan - No tasks foreseen.

<u>II-B-14 Rail, Waterway and Other Elements of Metropolitan Transportation Plan</u> - Identify railand waterway deficiencies, priorities, and proposed rail and waterway improvement solutions and strategies. Provide documentation of process and recommendations in the update of the MTP.

(Primary work to be performed by lead planning agency staff except where noted.)

Safe & Accessible Transportation Options (Under II-B-11 Bicycle and Pedestrian Element of the Metropolitan Transportation Plan) - Provide safe and accessible transportation options.

In 2022, the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act has added a new Metropolitan Planning set-aside for Increasing Safe & Accessible Transportation Options. The Act requires each MPO to use at least 2.5% of its PL funds on specified planning activities to increase safe and accessible options for multiple travel modes for people of all ages and abilities. [§ 11206(b)]. The 2.5% set aside is provided by a separate allocation of PL funds (federal program code Y410). The MPO's share of this amount is distributed using the same allocation formula.

This funding requires no local match and the full funding amount of \$15,800 is 100% reimbursable.

This task may include the following activities to increase safe and accessible options for multiple travel modes for people of all ages and abilities:

- 1. Adoption of Complete Streets standards or policies.
- 2. Development of a Complete Streets prioritization plan that identifies a specific list of Complete Streets projects to improve the safety, mobility, or accessibility of a street.
- 3. Development of transportation plans to:
 - a. Create a network of active transportation facilities, including sidewalks, bikeways, or pedestrian and bicycle trails, to connect neighborhoods with destinations such as workplaces, schools, residences, businesses, recreation areas, healthcare and childcare services, or other community activity centers.
 - b. Integrate active transportation facilities with public transportation service or improve access to public transportation.
 - c. Create multiuse active transportation infrastructure facilities (including bikeways or pedestrian and bicycle trails) that make connections within or between communities.
 - d. Increase public transportation ridership; and
 - e. Improve the safety of bicyclists and pedestrians.
- 4. Regional and megaregional planning (i.e., multi-jurisdictional transportation planning that extends beyond MPO and/or State boundaries) that address travel demand and capacity constraints through alternatives to new highway capacity, including through intercity passenger rail; and
- 5. Development of transportation plans and policies that support transit-oriented development.

<u>III-D-3 Special Studies: Consultant - Organizational Assessment Phase 2</u> – The WMPO has funded an Organizational Assessment to better understand how it is performing based on the needs of our members and an evaluation of the roles, responsibilities, staffing, program delivery, and structure of the organization. The recommendations from this assessment will be used to deliver services more efficiently and effectively to our members.

The US Census released the Urbanized Area (UZA) data on December 29, 2022. NCGS § 136-200.2. Decennial review of metropolitan planning organization boundaries, structure, and governance requires that "– Following each decennial census, and more frequently if requested by an individual metropolitan planning organization, the Governor, and the Secretary of Transportation, in cooperation with the affected metropolitan planning organization or organizations, shall initiate an evaluation of the boundaries, structure, and governance of each metropolitan planning organization in the State. This review could require changes to the organizational boundaries, structure, and/or governance. Funding in the amount of \$50,000 is included in the FY 24 Unified Planning Work Program for an Organizational Assessment Phase II for a consultant to assist with providing recommendations regarding the organizational boundaries, structure, and/or governance. The consultant could also assist in drafting updates to the UPWP, Lead Planning Agreement (LPA), and Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).

<u>III-D-3 Special Studies: Consultant - Grant Identification and Assistance</u> – The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) and Inflation Reduction Act of 2022 both include discretionary transportation grant programs. Depending on the specific grant requirements, these grants are open to MPOs, local municipalities, counties, Departments of Transportation, etc. to provide funding to advance transportation infrastructure. Many of these grants require a local (nonfederal) match and some require grant specific information. Depending on the notice of funding opportunity, these grants can be used for planning and/or implementation. The UPWP includes \$50,000 to hire a consultant to assist staff in monitoring and developing the necessary information for successful submittal of potential grant through these programs.

<u>III-D-3 Special Studies: Consultant - MTP Development</u> – The WMPO is required by federal law to develop a long-range Metropolitan Transportation Plan with a minimum 20-year planning horizon. The current plan, Cape Fear Moving Forward 2045, was adopted by the WMPO Board on November 18, 2020. The next plan is required to be adopted no later than November 18, 2025. The creation of this long-range Metropolitan Transportation Plan takes more than 2 years to prepare prior to adoption. This plan is developed primarily in-house with a consultant only

developing the financial section.

MPO staff has begun to embark on the plan development and will officially kick-off the plan in March 2023. The FY 24 Unified Planning Work Program includes \$70,000 for the MPO to hire a consultant to begin the development of the financial element.

<u>III-E Management and Operations</u> - Required ongoing administrative and operational tasks b support MPO committees and reporting requirements.

<u>III-E Management & Operations: Staff Time - TDM Program</u> - The TDM Program will move forward using STBG-DA and 5303 funding and will continue to be performed by inhouse staff. The TDM Program has been successful in promoting the Commuter Friendly Employer Program, Bike Month, the River to Sea Bike Ride, and the Commuter Challenge. This program works with local employers to promote alternative modes of transportation and TDM strategies such as carpooling, vanpooling, telecommuting, and personalized commuter plans. The program has completed two successful "Be A Looker" campaigns, maintains a dedicated Go Coast website, and promotes the carpool matching platform Share the Ride NC. The 2021 update to the short-range TDM plan, "Cape Fear Change in Motion 2020", will continue to guide TDM efforts in our region through 2025. The Go Coast program will continue to pursue the implementation of a Bike Share program(s) in the region and regularly update TDM related resources like area bike maps and model policies.

Narrative of Safe Streets for All (SS4A) New Funding for a Special Study

(Primary work to be performed by a contracted consultant.)

The federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) established the new Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) discretionary program with \$5 billion to be dispersed over the life of the program. The grant program funds are to be awarded on a competitive basis to support planning, infrastructure, behavioral, and operational initiatives to prevent death and serious injury on roads and streets involving all roadway users, including pedestrians; bicyclists; public transportation, personal conveyance, and micro-mobility users; motorists; and commercial vehicle operators.

The SS4A program provides funding for the completion of Action Plans and Implementation. To access the implementation funding, a Comprehensive Safety Action Plans meeting the USDOT standards must first be completed. Applications are accepted annually. The estimated cost to complete A Comprehensive Safety Action Plan for the Wilmington MPO's planning area is \$500,000. The grant provides federal funding in the amount of 80% and requires a 20% local match. The North Carolina Department of Transportation is not an eligible applicant but has committed to provide \$50,000 in funding as a local match and if awarded MPO members would provide the remaining \$50,000. Following adoption of the Comprehensive Safety Action Plan, this plan will provide an opportunity for our members with the ability to seek SS4A Implementation funding to improve and enhance safety in the communities served by the MPO.

<u>III-D-3</u> Special Studies: Consultant - Safe Streets for All – An outside consultant will be contracted to complete a Comprehensive Safety Action Plan. At this time a consultant has not been chosen.

Based on anticipated expenditures, the line item increased by \$5,400

When preparing the FY24 UPWP, staff estimated that the cost would be \$70,000 for a consultant to provide a financial forecast for the 2050 MTP. Staff selected Kimley Horn, an approved on-call consultant, to perform the task of identifying appropriate revenue sources, seeking out innovative funding techniques, and preparing cost estimates for potential 2025 - 2050 MTP projects. Estimates include the following modes of transportation: Aviation, Bicycle & Pedestrian, Ferry & Water Transportation, Rail, Public Transportation, and Roadway. Based on Kimley Horn's estimate of \$75,371, this line item increased by \$5,400.

III-D-3 Special Studies: Consultant - Organizational Analysis Phase 2

Based on anticipated expenditures, the line item decreased by \$5,400

Due to a decrease in scope for the Organization Analysis Phase 2, staff recommends moving funds from this study to the MTP Development. This fund shift will offset the increased MTP Development consultant cost; yielding a \$0 change in the UPWP budgeted totals.



On November 15, 2021, the Federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) infrastructure package was signed into law, revising and expanding the funds available for qualifying projects.

The Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (WMPO) is the recipient of allocated funds for Surface Transportation Block Grant Program (STBGP) Direct Attributable, Transportation Alternatives Set Aside and Carbon Reduction Program in the following amounts for the federal fiscal year of October 1, 2023 thru September 30, 2024.

STBGP Direct Attributable (DA) - \$4,081,889 Transportation Alternatives Set Aside (TA) - \$513,872 Carbon Reduction Efforts (CR) - \$502,487

The funds are available for obligation until September 30, 2027, with any amounts not obligated on or before this date to be returned. The Federal share payable shall be up to 80% percent of qualifying costs. Participating jurisdictions are responsible for 20% of the project costs. At the regularly scheduled May 31, 2023 meeting, the Board of the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (WMPO) approved the FY24 grant application guidelines to allow member jurisdictions to submit projects for review and approval.

The WMPO issued a call for projects on July 7, 2023. The call for projects had an initial presubmittal date of August 11, 2023 and a final deadline of September 15, 2023. A total of six (6) project applications were received, of which three (3) which were ranked according to the established revised application guidelines. Follows is the list of ranked projects in descending order:

New Hanover County N. College Road Pedestrian Infrastructure Improvements Requested STBGP – DA funding: \$1,840,000 Matching funds: \$460,000

Town of Carolina Beach St. Joseph's Multi-use Path Requested TASA – DA funding: \$1,172,760 Matching funds: \$293,190

Town of Belville Belville Elementary School and Riverwalk Park NC 133 Traffic Safety Improvements Requested Carbon Reduction funding: \$1,230,888 Matching funds: \$307,722

Total requested sum of awards: \$4,243,648

At the regularly scheduled meeting on October 11, 2023, the TCC unanimously approved the recommended amounts listed. The total sum of requested funds does not exhaust the allocation for the WMPO planning service area. The remaining funds will be placed in reserve, available for qualifying projects.

Subject:	2023 Smoothed/Adjusted Area Boundary

Following the decennial census and the release of U.S. Census Bureau urban area boundary data, MPO's are required to review and adjust their urban area boundaries, as needed. The smoothed or adjusted urban area boundary is based on the U.S. Census urban area boundary but is contiguous and is intended to address irregularities in the urban area boundary. The smoothed or adjusted urban area boundary differs from the urban area boundary as it may include additional areas to facilitate funding flexibility or maintain administrative continuity. An urban area boundary is based on population density and is determined by the U.S. Census Bureau. A smoothed or adjusted urban area boundary is based on urban area boundary but determined by the MPO, through coordination with the North Carolina Department of Transportation, and the Federal Highway Administration.


The smoothed urban area boundary determines the official urban designations for roadways which impacts federal-aid eligibility. Under Title 23, U.S.C., interstates, arterials, major collectors, and minor urban collectors are identified as federal-aid eligible facilities, with local roads and rural minor collectors being excluded. To prevent the urban designation of roadways from frequently switching designation following the results of the decennial census, FHWA allows states and MPOs to smooth, or adjust the boundaries in a cooperative process with planning partners. Areas cannot be removed from the urban area boundary, but areas may be added to improve continuity and to facilitate increased flexibility to a multitude of federally highway and transit programs as noted in Section 105 of the Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1973 which modifies Section 101(a) of title 23, U.S.C.

Boundaries are to be smoothed, or adjusted, to address irregularities, maintain administrative continuity for surrounding routes, and to encompass fringe areas that have commercial, industrial, national defense, or residential significance. Transportation terminals that are an asset to the area

such as airports and seaports should also be considered and included within the smoothed urban area boundary, so long as they are located within a reasonable distance of the urban area boundary. Logistical control points for transportation linkages like major crossroads and interchanges should also be given consideration for inclusion in the smoothed urban area boundary, so long as inclusion does not excessively distort the urban area. Adjustments to the boundary are not to be done to accommodate a single project.

Adjustments to the urban area boundaries are expected to be approved by the State transportation agency, the North Carolina Department of Transportation, and the Federal Highway Administration's Division Office by December 29, 2023.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Board of the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization hereby adopts the smoothed Urbanized Area Boundary for the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization.

CAPE FEAR NAVIGATING CHANGE 2050

Project Description/Scope: The WMPO has begun the planning process for our region's 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), Cape Fear Navigating Change 2050. A long-range Metropolitan Transportation Plan for the region is federally required and must be developed, updated, and adopted by the WMPO every five years. The final plan will be used by federal, state, and local governments to guide decision-making for transportation projects in our region over the next 25 years, including which projects receive state or federal funding, the design and location of local roadways, coordinating land use and development, and identifying projects for further plans and studies. Planning activities began in April of 2023 with plan adoption expected in November of 2025.

Project Status and Next Steps:

- In June and July of 2023, a Citizen Advisory Committee, to guide public outreach, and a MTP Technical Steering Committee, to guide plan development, were convened. The Citizen Advisory Committee will continue to meet during phases 1 and 2 of public outreach. The MTP Technical Steering Committee will continue to meet for the duration of plan development.
- On August 1, 2023, phase 1 of public outreach began, and will conclude on November 30, 2023. Six public meetings were held in August, five in-person and one virtual. An online survey was launched on August 1, 2023, and is available at wmpo.org until November 30, 2023. Phase 1 of public outreach will continue through November 30th with stakeholder interviews and focus groups, pop-up events and presentations across the region.
- Phase 2 of public outreach will occur in June 2025 when comments will be sought on the draft plan.

PENDER COUNTY BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN PLAN

Project Description/Scope: Pender County, in collaboration with the WMPO and consultant WSP, seeks to develop a comprehensive Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan to direct multi-modal development within the southern portion of the County. The final plan will be used to prioritize bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure implementation that will improve mobility, increase safety, and strengthen the connectivity for multi-modal transportation options in southern Pender County. The notice to proceed was issued in late September 2022.

Project Status and Next Steps:

- The Draft Plan has been finalized.
- The Plan is expected go before the Pender County Board of Commissioners in October 2023.
- The Plan is expected go before the WMPO Technical Coordinating Committee and Board in November 2023.

NCDOT IMD FEASIBILITY STUDY GRANTS

Project Description/Scope: In July 2022, the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) was allocated \$2 million in one-time funding from the North Carolina General Assembly to establish a Paved Trails Feasibility Study Program. The Integrated Mobility Division (IMD) was also awarded \$500,000 in State Planning and Research (SP&R) funds to support sidewalk and shared-use path feasibility studies. The purpose of the Paved Trails and Sidewalk Feasibility Studies Grant Program is to improve the

pipeline of bicycle and pedestrian projects accessing state and federal funding, resulting in successful implementation of projects led by communities prioritizing multimodal infrastructure.

Wilmington Downtown Trail Phases 2 & 3:

The Downtown Trail will eventually connect the River to Sea Bikeway to the future Multimodal Transportation Center, Cape Fear Community College, and the Riverwalk. In between these locations, the trail will provide a recreational facility for several communities in proximity to the downtown. The project currently consists of three phases. The first phase, from 3rd Street to Archie Blue Park, is in the preliminary engineering phase. The purpose of this study would be to assess the feasibility of constructing Phases 2 and 3. A scoping meeting with NCDOT IMD and the selected consultant, Kittelson, was held on May 2, 2023.

Project Status and Next Steps:

- The first steering committee is anticipated to take place in October 2023.
- The first public outreach sessions are anticipated to take place in the fourth week of October 2023.
- Final study report anticipated in late spring/early summer 2024.

Gullah Geechee Heritage Trail:

The purpose of this study would be to assess the feasibility of constructing a 10'-12' multi-use path facility in the Gullah Geechee Heritage Corridor from Phoenix Park in Navassa to Brunswick Nature Park in unincorporated Brunswick County. TRANSPORTATION DEMAND MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

The WMPO Board approved Cape Fear Change in Motion 2020, the short-range TDM Plan which will guide Go Coast initiatives from 2021 to 2025. This plan identifies seven short-range strategies to increase mobility options and reduce traffic in the WMPO region. These strategies are: Alternative Work Schedules, Bike Share Program, Carpool and Vanpool, Consulting for Telecommuting Opportunities, Fostering a Bicycle and Pedestrian Friendly Culture, Improved TDM-Focused Collaboration, and Personalized Commuter Plans.

Go Coast current initiatives and project status:

- 1. Go Coast Committee The next Go Coast committee meeting will occur on November 16, 2023, at 3 PM.
- 2. Be a Looker WMPO and Go Coast will promote the Be a Looker campaign from April 2023 through October 2023, which encourages safety among all road users including motorists, bicyclists, and pedestrians, through attending events, presentations, distributing informational brochures, advertising, and social media. Bicycle helmets received from an NCDOT grant will be distributed during this campaign to children from low-income families. So far there have been 192 Be A Looker pledges from 11 events attended since April as well as online pledges.

- 3. Get There Greener The Go Coast committee has worked to rebrand the WMPO's annual Commuter Challenge. The new name is "Get There Greener" and the focus is on sustainable transportation and replacing single-occupancy vehicle trips with bicycling, carpooling, walking, public transportation, or teleworking. The challenge takes place during the month of October and participants can log their miles traveled by alternative transportation to win prizes donated by local businesses. - 4. Brunswick Heritage Riverside Ride The 3rd Annual Brunswick Heritage Riverside Ride took place Saturday, September 30, 2023. This 16-mile casual-paced ride travels along the Gullah Geechee Cultural Heritage Corridor in northern Brunswick County. This year, there were 131 riders.



Cape Fear Public Transportation Authority October 2023 Update

<u>Ridership Update</u>

For September 2023, Wave Transit showed a gain of 1% for fixed-route and microtransit services as compared to September 2022. For the same comparison months, UNCW shuttle ridership decreased 20%, which lowered Wave's overall monthly ridership to 66,177 trips, a decrease of 7%.

RideMICRO's (microtransit) September 2023 ridership was 1,687 trips per month, a 28% percent increase as compared to September 2022.

Ridership was higher in all aspects from the previous year save for UNCW shuttle ridership.

Short-Range Transit Plan

The Cape Fear Public Transportation Board of Directors held a workshop on Wave Transit's Short Range Transit Plan (SRTP) on September 22. The Wave staff and Nelson/Nygaard, the Consultant, provided an overview and timeline of the planning process, updated ridership figures, information from an initial market analysis and route and service design best practices that provide for an efficient and strong performing transit system.

The Plan will include development of different scenarios for service including one based on reduced funding, one that is budget neutral, and one that is based on the potential for increased funding in the future. The Plan will also include extensive public outreach starting in early November and the final report is expected to be completed in the spring of 2024.

Shelter Installs

Four shelters will be installed in the system, where both ridership and pedestrian safety best allow them. Conversations are ongoing with an on-call Consultant who would oversee the design and installation of these small capital projects.

OCTOBER TPD UPDATES WILMINGTON MPO

October 2023

Brunswick County Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP): The last steering committee meeting was on June 27th, where the committee made decisions on public involvement feedback. Updates to the report and appendix were made during the month of July by TPD engineer and submitted to TPD management in early August. Currently, the CTP is being reviewed by TPD management. After reviews are complete, report and appendix will again be updated, and TPD engineer and RPO planner will start preparing for local adopting agency presentations.

Wilmington Model: Recently, the Wilmington MPO verified base year socio-economic (SE) data and provided growth for future year socio-economic data. TPD is working on base year model estimation and reviewing growth for future year SE data feedback before working on future year scenarios for the model.

Pender County Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP): The Pender County CTP will start in fall of this year. The last Pender County CTP was adopted in 2015. The base year for this CTP will be 2021 and horizon year will be 2050. The Wilmington MPO area will not be included in the Pender County CTP.
