1. Call to Order

Chairman Hank Miller called the meeting to order at 3:00pm. Mike Kozlosky, WMPO Executive Director, called the roll.

2. Roll Call

Present: Mike Allen, Lynn Barbee, Brenda Bozeman, John Ellen, Brad George, Hank Miller, Dane Scalise, Kevin Spears, Luke Waddell, Mike Forte, Eulis Williams, Landon Zimmer

Absent: Bill Rivenbark

3. Conflict of Interest Statement

Chairman Miller read the conflict-of-interest statement as required by General Statute and requested any conflicts of interest be disclosed by the Board. No statements were given.

4. Approval of Board Member Excused Absences

Mr. Kozlosky reported that Bill Rivenbark had requested an excused absence. Mr. Scalise entered a motion to approve of his absence, seconded by Ms. Bozeman. The motion passed unanimously.

5. Approval of the Agenda

Chairman Miller requested a motion to approve the agenda. Mr. Scalise made the motion, seconded by Mr. Forte. The motion carried unanimously.

6. Public Comment Period

Chairman Miller opened the public comment period.

Bijan Salehi, from A Caring Heart. The bridge on Hewletts Creek is not big enough to accommodate the amount of traffic. Navaho Bike Trail should be extended all the way to Monkey Junction, so that people can ride their bikes to the bus transfer station. The drainage system Mr. Salehi requested previously, he believes, should be drained to Hewletts Creek. Mr. Salehi believes we need more streetlights on Masonboro Loop Road, and he would like more sidewalks. Mr. Salehi voiced his concern about the sewage treatment plant, next to the Exxon, being more contained.

Jerod Patterson, President/CEO from Business Alliance for Sound Economy (BASE). Mr. Patterson introduced himself and his organization. Mr. Patterson stated that the members of BASE are drawn together by the idea of growing the region in a smart and sustainable way. Mr. Patterson believes WMPO's work back in January 2024, concerning the Cape Fear Memorial Bridge, was difficult and prudent for the local area, and he believes it is important to stay the course and trust the process moving forward. He would like to convey his and his organization's support for the Board to continue the path they are on for the timely funding and replacement of the Cape Fear Bridge.

Natalie English, from Wilmington Chamber of Commerce. Ms. English thanked the Board for their vote last January 2024, to consider all the options involving funding for the replacement of the Cape Fear Bridge. Ms. English stated that she was in DC and received good feedback as to when they would get back to her on the status of the project and she is hopeful. Ms. English is wanting the Board to continue to maintain their course and explore all avenues to keep the bridge open and safe. The second concern that Ms. English shared was she would like the project at Military Cutoff/Eastwood Road to stay on track. She understands that there will be a little bit of pain for the local businesses, but Ms. English stated that the Chamber of Commerce will be there to help and guide the businesses and consumers through this much needed project.

John Lennon, resident of Marywood Drive, Wilmington, also Vice Chair of BASE, Mr. Lennon stated that he was on the Board of Transportation when prioritization was implemented and has seen the benefits of having this system. He reminded the Board that the decision they made by their vote in January 2024 has secured progress for the Cape Fear Bridge project and that their vote today on the resolution before them would continue that progress. He humbly asked the Board to approve the resolution.

7. Presentations

a. Town of Leland Comprehensive Safety Action Plan, Ben Andrea, Town of Leland

Ben Andrea from the Town of Leland presented the Board with an overview of the Town of Leland's Safety Action Plan (SAP) starting with a definition of "What Is Vision Zero" and why should Leland participate. He proceeded to share how the Town of Leland thought they could approach a safer system and shared the timeline for the project, Leland SS4A SAP. Mr. Andrea highlighted the focus groups and public outreach the Town used to gather feedback and how that feedback and historical data were used to establish two tiers of recommended projects. The first tier are projects that can be done right away, fairly simple projects, low cost, with relatively high benefits. The second tier are more complex projects that need more funding, time, and projects that may need to be tied into the Town's CTP (Comprehensive Transportation Plan)/MTP (Metropolitan Transportation Plan) or STIP (State Transportation Improvement Program). Mr. Andrea then spoke about how they implemented the next steps and how that is happening quickly after the adoption of the plan. He also stated that they will be measuring successes and being proactive with the plan. Mr. Andrea wrapped up his presentation by thanking all the people who helped with the plan and asked if there are any questions. There were no questions. WMPO Executive Director Mike Kozlosky reminded the Board that the Leland Town Plan will be incorporated into the WMPO Safe Streets For All Plan per grant guidelines, since the Town of Leland started their plan first.

b. Cape Fear Navigating Change 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan, Greer Templer, Beth King, Carolyn Caggia, and Tessa Jones, WMPO

Greer Templer began the presentation by giving an overview of the Metropolitan Transportation Plan and the requirements it must meet from the Federal laws. Ms. Templer also went over the timeline of this draft MTP, highlighting where the WMPO is at this time.

Carolyn Caggia continued the WMPO presentation speaking about the efforts the WMPO took with public engagement to incorporate public opinion and data into the plan. Ms. Caggia also gave a summary of the information that was discovered during Phase 1 of Public Outreach.

Beth King highlighted the existing conditions of transportation in the WMPO planning area and the Federal Requirements that needed to be accounted for when moving forward with the draft MTP. Ms. King explained how the WMPO developed their vision statement and what that vision statement is. She also

explained how that vision statement combined with the WMPO Strategic Plan and Federal Planning Factors lead to the goals of the 2050 MTP. Ms. King explained that the vision and goals combined with the modal objectives gave a basis for project scoring and modal policy.

Greer Templer presented how the WMPO worked with the member jurisdictions and planning partners to develop project cost estimates and the funding projections through 2050 highlighting alternative revenue opportunities. Ms. Templer also gave an overview of the draft plan given to the Board.

Tessa Jones explained what the Public Outreach for the second phase of this plan looks like, including the purpose of it, the timeline of the public comment period, where you can view the draft plan, and the different ways to submit your comments. Ms. Jones also gave dates of multiple open-house events occurring soon and went over the next steps of the MTP timeline.

Mr. Waddell stated that getting public input is never easy and he believes the panel did a great job at reaching out to receive public concerns.

8. Consent Agenda

Chairman Miller asked for any additions or concerns about the consent agenda items to be raised. Mr. Scalise made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda, seconded by Mr. Forte. The motion passed unanimously.

9. Regular Agenda

a. Resolution confirming the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization's position regarding the Cape Fear Memorial Bridge Replacement Project.

Mike Kozlosky stated that in February 2022 the WMPO Board endorsed exploring all potential funding options to replace the Cape Fear Memorial Bridge. By January of 2024, the WMPO Board requested NCDOT modify the WMPO's submittal for the Cape Fear Memorial Bridge replacement to be scored as a toll facility. At this point in time, the WMPO has been requested to reaffirm that the WMPO desires NCDOT to include the tolled version of the project in the Final 2026-2035 State Transportation Improvement Program and the WMPO intends to include the toll project in an adopted plan.

Mr. Kozlosky stated that the resolution is procedural in nature and will confirm previous actions and/or direction provided by the WMPO Board he is happy to answer any questions.

Ms. Bozeman, Town of Leland, cited her Boards's concerns with the resolution as follows:

- a. They are not aware of any non-tolled infrastructure being replaced with tolled infrastructure.
- b. Concerned about the legal implications and precedence set of requiring new tolls on already existing routes.
- c. Concerned about the toll amount, structure for tolls, and length of tolls have not been presented or considered.
- d. Concerned that a private organization's involvement in the project will increase the costs or the duration of the toll amounts.
- e. Concerned that the impact on nearby non-tolled infrastructure by adding tolled infrastructure to the transportation network is not being fully considered and evaluated.
- f. Concerned that the STIP process does not reasonably and equitably evaluate bridges, particularly existing bridges.

Chairman Miller asked for any additions or concerns about the regular agenda. Mr. Scalise made a motion to approve the Regular Agenda, seconded by Mr. Zimmer. The motion passed by an 8 to 4 vote with Brenda Bozemen, Kevin Spears, Luke Waddell and Eulis Willis opposed.

10. Discussion

a. 2024-2033 STIP/MPO Transportation Improvement Program Administrative Modifications #25-4

Mike Kozlosky opened the floor to any questions the Board may have about the administrative modifications #25-4; this modification will be brought back to the Board for approval at their next meeting.

- b. **Final 2026-2035 State/MPO Transportation Improvement Program**Mike Kozlosky stated that he believes they will receive the final version of the STIP by the end of this week or early next week, starting the public comment period and approval timeline.
- c. WMPO Direct Attributable Call for Projects and Submittal Guidelines
 Krysden Burden and Caitlin Cerza presented an overview of the updated process
 for "Call for Direct Attributable Projects" noting the changes to the process and
 reasoning why those changes. Ms. Burden and Ms. Cerza also went over the next
 steps, as far as adopting the changes to the process.

Lynn Barbee questioned Executive Director Kozlosky about the call for projects being annual vs. the five-year call. Mr. Kozlosky responded that this new "Call for Projects" process is the result of the Board requesting to try a 5-year call for projects, in which the Board can fund projects over the 5-year window, allowing for more flexibility and the funding of more projects.

Eulis Willis stated his concern that in order to get a project looked at it seems that you have to have current safety issues/crashes as opposed to foreseeing safety issues. Ms. Cerza acknowledged Mr. Willis's concerns and stated that they will include his concerns in the development of this process.

d. WMPO Safe Streets and Roads for All Commitment

Abby Lorenzo gave an update on the WMPO's efforts to develop the Safe Streets and Roads for All Plan. Ms. Lorenzo spoke about leadership commitment and what needs to go into the plan to make it successful. She highlighted the next steps that will need to happen, along with the timeline of when the plan could potentially be adopted. Ms. Lorenzo asked if there were any questions, there were none.

e. Prioritization 8.0 Schedule and Process

Abby Lorenzo presented the Prioritization 8.0 Schedule and Process highlighting the changes from the 7.0 Schedule and Process.

Mr. Scalise commented that there is an ongoing trend, costs are going up, income is flattening, Charlotte and Raleigh are looking to do other things, NC is one of the fastest growing states, he stated that if we do not want to get left behind we need to start thinking outside the box in order to keep the pace.

f. Federal Functional Classification

Greer Templer gave an overview of the post-census roadway federal functional classification system review and presented what the proposed recommendations/changes would be. Ms. Templer then opened the floor for questions, there were none.

11. Updates

a. Wilmington Urban Area MPO

Mike Kozlosky thanked the WMPO staff for their efforts during Bike Month. Mr. Kozlosky also gave an update on Transportation Reauthorization, stating that Congress is looking to reauthorize the transportation bill, Mr. Kozlosky was in DC and discussed the Board priorities as they relate to reauthorization. Mr. Kozlosky's last update was a recognition that the WMPO received from the Historical Wilmington Foundation for the renovation of the building that houses the WMPO.

b. Cape Fear Public Transit Authority

Updates are in the packet

c. NCDOT Division 3

Updates are in the packet, but Trevor Carroll is willing to answer any questions. Mr. George questioned when the work being done on US17 by the high school would be completed, Mr. Carroll said he would reach out to Mr. George when he knew the specifics. Luke Waddell stated that the Wilmington City Council adopted a resolution at their last meeting urging the NCDOT to hold a new public meeting regarding the changes at Military Cutoff/Eastwood Rd., Mr. Waddell questioned Mr. Carroll if the NCDOT had received that resolution and has there been any discussion about holding the public meeting. Mr. Carroll stated they are aware of the resolution, they have not made a final determination, and the NCDOT will be providing a formal answer to the City.

d. NCDOT Integrated Mobility Division

Updates in the packet.

e. NCDOT TPD

Nazia Sarder had an update in addition to the packet, Pender County CTP meeting will be end of June instead of end of May.

f. WMPO Board Members

John Ellen stated that since May is Bike Month, and he is a bike enthusiast with a little over 300 bike miles already accounted for this month, this Friday, his 80th birthday, he will be riding 80 miles!! He encouraged everyone to come ride with him; he will be starting at 7am.

RESOLUTION APPROVING AMENDMENT #25-3 TO THE 2024-2033 STATE /MPO TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAMS

WHEREAS, the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization provides transportation planning services for the City of Wilmington, Town of Carolina Beach, Town of Kure Beach, Town of Wrightsville Beach, Town of Belville, Town of Leland, Town of Navassa, New Hanover County, Brunswick County, Pender County, Cape Fear Public Transportation Authority and the North Carolina Board of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, the Board has found that the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization is conducting transportation planning in a continuous, cooperative, and comprehensive manner; and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Board of Transportation adopted the 2024-2033 State Transportation Improvement Program on June 6, 2023, and the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization Board adopted the Statewide/MPO Transportation Improvement Programs on August 30, 2023; and

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Introduction

Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) are federally designated local transportation planning agencies that are responsible for conducting regional transportation planning in a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive manner. MPOs were introduced by the Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1973 and are required to represent localities in all urbanized areas with populations over 50,000. The Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (WMPO) is the MPO recognized by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) for the Wilmington Urban Area.

The MPO consists of representatives from the City of Wilmington (lead planning agency), Town of Wrightsville Beach, Town of Carolina Beach, Town of Kure Beach, Town of Belville, Town of Leland, Town of Navassa, New Hanover County, Brunswick County, Pender County, the Cape Fear Public Transportation Authority and North Carolina Department of Transportation. The MPO's planning area is approximately 494 square miles and encompasses the entirety of New Hanover County and portions of Brunswick and Pender Counties.

The WMPO board adopted this submittal guide on June 25, 2025 (tentative). It introduces a new approach for the WMPO to award direct attributable funds. Starting with fiscal years (FY) 2025-2026 and 2026-2027, the WMPO will accept proposals for new projects every two years. Applications for supplemental funds due to funding shortfalls may be submitted on a rolling, as-needed basis.

Project Funding

The WMPO receives allocated funds from the Surface Transportation Block Grant Program (STBG). The STBG program offers discretionary funding that states and local governments can utilize for various projects aimed at improving the condition and performance of Federal-aid highways, bridges, and tunnels. This funding can also be applied to improvements on public roads, as well as pedestrian and bicycle infrastructure, and transit capital projects. STBG program funding is allocated through state transportation agencies, and the selection of projects is decided upon by the State Department of Transportation (DOT) or local MPO.

The federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) was signed into law on November 15, 2021. This act revised and expanded the funding availability for qualifying infrastructure projects. Several provisions of the IIJA provided greater flexibility in the use of federal funds for these projects. Funding examples include the Transportation Alternatives set-aside (TA) and the Carbon Reduction Program (CRP). The funds from the IIJA can be obligated until September 30, 2026, and any amounts not obligated by that date will need to be returned.

The table on page 4 outlines the availability of discretionary funds over the next five fiscal years. Please note that the amounts for FY 2026-2027 through FY 2029-2030 are estimated totals. Approximately \$2,000,000 is set aside each fiscal year for WMPO operations and to cover project shortfalls.

Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible for funding, a project must meet the minimum criteria outlined in this section. The applicant(s) must electronically submit a completed application and supplemental materials. Co-applications may be submitted by designating a primary and secondary applicant. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

The criteria below meet federal and state funding requirements and the goals adopted by the WMPO Board. Projects that do not meet these criteria will not be considered for funding. Applications not prioritized for funding will not be automatically considered in subsequent years and should be resubmitted in the next call for projects.

I. Federal Aid Eligible

Federal eligibility requirements for the STGB program can be found in US Code <u>23 USC §133</u>. Additional information regarding federal eligibility can also be found at www.fhwa.dot.gov/specialfunding/stp/.

II. MTP/LRTP Compliant

Projects submitted for consideration must be identified in the WMPO's adopted 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) fiscally constrained list, the WMPO's draft 2050 MTP fiscally constrained roadway project list, or the draft 2050 MTP non-highway priority project lists. A copy of the 2045 MTP can be found at www.wmpo.org/mtp/ and the draft 2050 MTP can be found at www.wmpo.org/2050mtp-public-comment/.

III. Locally Administered

Applicants are responsible for all federal and state reporting requirements related to discretionary funding. They are also expected to provide progress reports to the WMPO Board upon request. An inter-local agreement between the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) and the designated recipient will specify a reimbursement schedule. The recipient will be responsible for covering all project costs, submitting invoices to the NCDOT, and receiving reimbursement for the project. While the WMPO may assist with reporting and coordinating efforts between the NCDOT and the recipient, the ultimate responsibility for the project remains with the recipient.

IV. Commitment of Local Funds

All projects must have a minimum local match of 20% of the total project costs. Discretionary funds will cover up to 80% of eligible costs. Recipients will be responsible for any overruns exceeding the final programmed cost estimate. This provision may be reviewed at the discretion of the WMPO Board and may be adjusted through additional amendments to the Surface Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) by the Board of Transportation, if necessary.

V. Project Design Intent

Project design intent must meet or exceed Federal, State, and local guidelines for design elements, including any minimum widths, safety elements, or controls.

Program Administrative Details

I. Informational and Pre-Submittal Meetings

After the call for projects is released, WMPO staff will host an informational meeting on July 16, 2025 to explain the application process, review the application form, and discuss the scoring criteria. Applicants will have the opportunity to submit their applications by August 15, 2025 for staff review and feedback before submitting the final version.

II. Transit Project Funding

Projects from local transit authorities that involve improvements not typically classified by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) may have their funding transferred to the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) for distribution. This transfer will take place after the funding award has been granted. Applicants should note that the authorization processing time may be extended due to this additional review step.

III. Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

If a project awarded does not have an assigned TIP category, a TIP amendment will be required. Applicants should be aware that this amendment process may delay the funding obligation timeline.

IV. Project Submittal Limits

Please limit submittals to no more than thirty (30) pages, including appendices.

Application Materials

Applicants are required to submit the following materials with their application:

I. Funding Request Form

The Funding Request Form must be signed by the primary applicant and secondary applicant (*if applicable*) to be considered complete. Additional instructions to aid in completing the form can be found in the next section.

II. Scoring Rubric

The Scoring Rubric is a Microsoft Excel file that can be downloaded at the following **link**. Applicants should fill out the "Applicant Scoring" column highlighted in orange. If no points are awarded for a row, please leave the cell blank. Scores are out of one hundred (100) total points. A detailed description of the Scoring Rubric criteria can be found beginning on page 8.

III. Map(s) of Proposed Project

At least one (1) map showing the project's location must be included with the application. The map should display street names and labeled points of interest to help the application reviewers identify the project area. Additional maps that support the points in the Scoring Rubric may be submitted, such as those highlighting the project's proximity to schools or medical facilities. Maps can be created using ArcGIS, ArcPro, or Google Earth.

IV. Opinion of Probable Project Costs

The detailed anticipated design (*if applicable*) and construction costs of the project must be prepared by a licensed Professional Engineer (PE) or a Project Management Professional (PMP) in the State of North Carolina. All associated costs related to the project's completion, including but not limited to engineering, right-of-way (ROW), utility relocations, and inspection/materials testing, should be presented in a line-item cost format displaying the material quantity and unit cost. Please see Appendix A for an example.

V. Inflation and Contingency Calculator

Given the rising costs of materials and supply chain issues, it is essential to factor in both inflation and construction contingency into the overall project total. Applicants must include the "Inflation and Contingency Calculator" Microsoft Excel file with their application. This file will calculate the values based on project status and funding fiscal year. Below are two tables outlining the estimated contingency and inflation costs to be added to the project total. Please note that inflation is compounded over the fiscal years.

VI. Project Schedule

Project schedule outlining key milestone dates, including deadlines for plan submissions at applicable stages and dates for requesting funding authorizations. Based on previous project timelines, we anticipate a minimum of 6 months to a year for project agreements to be executed and approximately twelve to eighteen months for right-of-way to be completed. Please develop schedules accordingly. An example project schedule can be found in Appendix B.

VII. Signed Resolution of Financial Support

A signed resolution on the letterhead of the Primary Applicant must be provided, authorizing a local match of no less than 20% of the total project cost. The resolution must include, in whole dollar amounts, the total project cost, the amount requested from the WMPO, and the local match total. Additionally, the resolution must indicate that the local matching funds will be allocated if the grant is awarded. An example is provided below:

"THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Wilmington hereby authorizes the Example Department to apply for \$800,000 in STBG-DA funding from the WMPO for the Example Multi-Use Path Design with a total project cost of \$1,000,000; and

THAT, funding for the required minimum 20% local grant match of \$200,000 from the City of Wilmington has been identified and will be appropriated if the grant is awarded."

When determining the requested funding amount, always round down to the nearest whole dollar. The local match amount should be rounded up to the nearest whole dollar. An example is provided below:

VIII. Additional Supporting Documents (optional)

The application submission may include exhibits or site photos with labels, additional maps, safety reports, crash records, and any adopted resolutions that support the project's goals. If additional supporting documents are submitted, it is essential to include a clear table of contents that outlines the contents of these documents.

The following descriptions are provided to assist with the completion of the Funding Request Form.

- 1. Project Name: A descriptive name of the project
- 2. Project Location: Physical location and extent of the project
- 3. TIP ID: If the project is already included in the NCDOT STIP, provide the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) number
- 4. Existing Project: Indicate whether this project is an extension of a previously completed or current, ongoing project (yes) or if this project is new (no)
- 5. Total Project Cost: Total cost of the project, <u>including</u> local match
- 6. Requested Funding Total: Total funding cost requested, which shall not exceed 80% of the total project cost
- 7. Local Match Total: Total amount of local match funding, which at minimum must be 20% of the total project cost
- 8. Anticipated Funding Start Year: Select the anticipated fiscal year to begin project funding
- 9. Primary Applicant: The name of the municipality or jurisdiction member submitting the application (ex. "City of Wilmington")
- 10. Secondary Applicant (*if applicable*): The name of the agency, organization, municipality, or jurisdiction member who is a joint applicant
- 11. Project Manager: The primary point of contact for the project, typically a representative of the primary applicant
- 12. Contact Person: Individual who the WMPO can contact if there are questions regarding the application
- 13. Contact Person Phone: Phone number for the contact person
- 14. Contact Person Email: Email address for the contact person

Scoring Rubric Guide

The following descriptions are provided to assist with completing the Scoring Rubric.

Safety (30 Points)

- 1. Reported Crashes & Accidents (Up to 10 Points): Does the project seek to improve safety at high-risk or high-crash locations? How many recorded crashes or accidents have occurred in the last five years (2019 to 2024) at or along the project location? Have there been any reported severe injuries (rated as A, Incapacitating) or fatalities (rated as K, Fatal)? Select all that apply.
 - a. One (1) to five (5) (2 points)
 - b. Six (6) to ten (10) (3 points)
 - c. Greater than ten (10) (5 points)
 - d. Reported severe injuries (if yes, 2 points)
 - e. Reported fatalities (if yes, 3 points)
- 2. Crash Severity (Up to 10 Points): If there have been reported crashes or accidents, what was the severity of the crash(es)? Select all that apply.
 - a. Fatal (K) or Incapacitating (A) (6 points)
 - b. Non-incapacitating (B) or Not visible, but complains of pain (C) (4 points)
 - c. Property damage (2 points)
- 3. Safety Upgrade or Installation (Up to 10 Points): Will the project be installing new, safety related infrastructure or will the project be upgrading the safety of existing infrastructure? Please explain in the project narrative.
 - a. New infrastructure (10 points)
 - b. Upgrades to existing infrastructure (5 points)

Fair (20 Points)

- 1. Project Location (10 Points): Does the project remove or cross a geographic and/or human made barrier? The barrier must be one of the following (1) natural stream, wetland, or other body of water; (2) railroad tracks; (3) arterial roadway; (4) major/minor collector road; or (5) grade separation. If yes, award 10 points and explain in the project narrative.
- 2. Increasing Connectivity (Up to 10 Points): Does the proposed project improve connectivity near an area with high traffic or frequently used community spaces? This includes the installation of multi-use paths (MUP), sidewalks, or other infrastructure.
 - a. Located or connects to a Traffic Analysis Zone* (TAZ) with high employment (3 points)
 - b. Located within a ¼ mile radius of a grocery store and/or medical facility (3 points)
 - c. Located within a ¼ mile radius of a school (K-12 or higher education), library, and/or government services (2 points)
 - d. Located within ¼ mile of public transit (2 points)

^{*}A TAZ is a geographic area used to analyze traffic flow and pattern. TAZ data can be requested from the WMPO until September 1, 2025. Please contact the WMPO Grants Coordinator, Krysden Burden, for data requests.

Connected (25 Points)

- 1. Connects to a Park or Greenspace (5 Points): Does the proposed project connect to an existing park or greenspace? If yes, award 5 points and explain in the project narrative.
- 2. Closing Gaps (Up to 5 Points): Does the proposed project include closing gaps within the existing infrastructure? What is the size of the gap? This can include closing gaps in the MUP network, sidewalks, or dedicated bike lanes.
 - a. Gap is greater than 1/8 mile (5 points)
 - b. Gap is less than 1/8 mile (2 points)
- **3. Expands Prior Project (5 Points):** Will the proposed project connect to an existing or currently ongoing WMPO or STIP funded project? If yes, award 5 points. Please provide the existing project details (TIP ID and status) in the project narrative.
- **4. Multi-Modal (5 Points):** Will the proposed project serve more than one (1) mode of transportation? If yes, award 5 points and explain in the project narrative.
- 5. Approved/Adopted Plan (5 Points): Is the proposed project part of an approved or adopted plan? Some examples include adopted land use plans, economic development plans, and tourism plans. If yes, award 5 points and indicate in the application narrative what plan(s) the project is a part of.

Resilient (15 Points)

- 1. Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) Element (5 Points): Does the proposed project include the implementation of ITS components such as signal preemption, emergency preparedness, or other features? If yes, award 5 points and explain in the project narrative what ITS components are included.
- **2. Data and Technology (5 Points):** Will the proposed project include elements that will improve data collection, analysis, or technology? If yes, award 5 points and explain in the project narrative.
- **3. Redundancy (5 Points):** Does the proposed project provide redundancy within the existing network, such as alternative routes and multi-modal options? If yes, award 5 points and explain in the project narrative.

Proactive (10 Points)

- 1. Project Phase (Up to 5 Points): How close is the project to final implementation or installation?
 - a. Right of Way Acquisition (3 points)
 - b. Construction (5 points)
- 2. Local Match (up to 5): Is the local match percentage greater than the required 20%?
 - a. 21% to 30% local match (2 points)
 - b. Greater than 30% local match (5 points)

Tiebreaker Elements

In the event the number of applications exceeds the funding amount available, and one or more selected projects receive the same number of points using the Scoring Rubric, the following elements will be used as a tiebreaker:

- Project with the lower cost
- Project closest to the bid date
- Project that scores highest in the safety category

CAPE FEAR NAVIGATING CHANGE

Project Description/Scope: The WMPO is progressing through the planning process for our region's 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), Cape Fear Navigating Change 2050. A long-range Metropolitan Transportation Plan for the region is federally required and must be developed, updated, and adopted by the WMPO every five years. The final plan will be used by federal, state, and local governments to guide decision-making for transportation projects in our region over the next 25 years, including which projects receive state or federal funding, the design and location of local roadways, coordinating land use and development, and identifying projects for further plans and studies. Planning activities began in April of 2023 with plan adoption expected in November of 2025.

2050 MTP Draft Document

The 30-day public comment period, Phase II of public outreach for the plan, was opened on May 28th by the WMPO Board. Public comments will be open until 5pm on June 27th.

Project Status and Next Steps:

- Phase II of public involvement is underway, guided by input from the CAC, and includes 4 inperson public comment opportunity events and 1 virtual open house option. Commenters can also
 submit their thoughts via an online submission form or via a comment card available at member
 jurisdiction planning offices or six public libraries throughout New Hanover, Brunswick, and
 Pender counties.
- Following Phase II, staff will work on refining the draft plan and responding to public comments.
- The final plan will be presented to the TCC and Board in the fall of 2025 for endorsement and adoption.

SAFE STREETS AND ROADS FOR ALL SAFETY ACTION PLAN

Project Description/Scope: The WMPO has begun work on its Safety Action Plan with the help of consultants Kittelson and Associates. Safety Action Plans are comprehensive safety plans aimed at reducing and eliminating serious-injury and fatal crashes affecting all roadway users. They are developed through data analysis and community input to identify significant safety risks which inform recommended countermeasures, strategies, and policies which aim to reduce crash severity and save lives. Planning activities for this effort began in April 2025 with plan adoption expected in Fall 2026.

Project Status and Next Steps:

- The first steering committee meeting was held on May 8, 2025, at the WMPO office in which the
 project team gathered feedback on existing conditions and draft vision, goals, and a leadership
 commitment.
- Phase 1 of public outreach will begin later in Summer 2025, with subsequent Phases occurring later in 2025, and will focus on existing conditions.
- A draft of the Safety Action plan is expected in early 2026.

INTELLIGENT TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM PLAN

Project Description/Scope: The WMPO has begun work on the development of an Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) Plan to guide the coordinated deployment and integration of technology-based transportation solutions across the region. The plan will assess existing ITS infrastructure, identify gaps and opportunities, and establish a regional architecture that aligns with state and federal standards. Its scope includes strategies to improve traffic signal coordination, incident management, traveler information systems, transit technology integration, and data sharing among agencies. The ITS Plan will serve as a strategic framework to enhance system efficiency, safety, and real-time responsiveness, supporting the WMPO's broader goals of improving mobility, reducing congestion, and fostering regional collaboration.

Project Status and Next Steps:

- WMPO staff initiated the project with consultants Kimley-Horn in December 2024 to outline the development process and next steps.
- The first core team meeting was held at the WMPO office on January 27, 2025.
- Subsequent core team meetings took place on March 10 and March 31, 2025.
- Stakeholder workshops 1 and 2 were held at the WMPO office on February 18 and April 29, 2025.
- One-on-one core team stakeholder meetings are ongoing, with the final core team meeting scheduled for June 19, 2025.
- The ITS plan remains on schedule for completion in 2025.

NCDOT IMD FEASIBILITY STUDY GRANTS

In July 2022, the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) was allocated \$2 million in one-time funding from the North Carolina General Assembly to establish a Paved Trails Feasibility Study Program. The Integrated Mobility Division (IMD) was also awarded \$500,000 in State Planning and Research (SP&R) funds to support sidewalk and shared-use path feasibility studies. The purpose of the Paved Trails and Sidewalk Feasibility Studies Grant Program is to improve the pipeline of bicycle and pedestrian projects accessing state and federal funding, resulting in successful implementation of projects led by communities prioritizing multimodal infrastructure.

Wilmington Downtown Trail Phases 2 & 3

The Downtown Trail will eventually connect the River to Sea Bikeway to the future Multimodal Transportation Center, Cape Fear Community College, and the Riverwalk. In between these locations, the trail will provide a recreational facility for several communities in proximity to the downtown. The project currently consists of three phases. The first phase, from 3rd Street to Archie Blue Park, is in the preliminary engineering phase. The purpose of this study would be to assess the feasibility of constructing Phases 2 and 3. A scoping meeting with NCDOT IMD and the selected consultant, Kittelson, was held on May 2, 2023.

- The first steering committee took place on October 17, 2023.
- The first public outreach sessions took place October-December 2023. Public engagement consisted of in-person events and an online survey that included an online comment map. In all, 486 survey responses were collected, 352 map comments were received, and 59 in-person conversations were conducted.
- The second steering committee meeting was held May 8, 2024.
- The second public outreach session was conducted during summer 2024. Public engagement consisted of two in-person events (listed below) and an online survey open June through July 15, 2024. 500 survey responses were received with 58 in-person conversations.
- Frankie's Outdoor Market, June 15, 2024
- Nir Family YMCA, June 18, 2024
- The final steering committee meeting took place Wednesday, October 9, 2024.
- Final feasibility study report was received in May and presentations to the WMPO TCC and Board will take place in June 2025.

Shelters only represent 6% of our passenger amenities, while other NC agencies average 14%. To meet the peer average for statewide systems, CFPTA needs to install an additional twenty-six (26) benches and twenty (20) shelters. This project will support the installation of a total of nine (9) bus stop benches and ten (10) bus stop shelters along eight (8) transit routes located within the City of Wilmington. TC-0027 WAVE PASSENGER AMENITIES AND UPGRADES

Project Description: Passenger Facilities and amenities replacement, security, and improvement: acquire, construct, or replace structures, equipment, and systems that provide passenger facilities and amenities for fixed route bus service in the Wilmington, NC UZA. Projects include acquisition and installation of bus shelters, lighting and landing platforms along existing routes; evaluation of a new customer service enclosure at Forden Transfer Station; and extension of fencing at Padgett Transfer Station.

TRANSPORTATION DEMAND MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

Project Description/Scope: The TDM "Go Coast" program works to increase the use of alternative transportation by WMPO residents and decrease Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT). The WMPO Board approved Cape Fear Change in Motion 2020, the short-range TDM Plan which will guide Go Coast initiatives from 2021 to 2025. This plan identifies seven short-range strategies to increase mobility options and reduce traffic in the WMPO region. These strategies are: Alternative Work Schedules, Bike Share Program, Carpool and Vanpool, Consulting for Telecommuting Opportunities, Fostering a Bicycle and Pedestrian Friendly Culture, Improved TDM-Focused Collaboration, and Personalized Commuter Plans.

Go Coast current initiatives and project status:

- 1. Go Coast Committee The next regular Go Coast committee meeting is scheduled to occur inperson on Thursday, August 12, from 3-5 p.m.
- 2. Bicycle Helmet Initiative –WMPO staff applied for and received 100 more children's bicycle helmets through NCDOT's 2025 grant cycle for the Bicycle Helmet Initiative. Helmets are being distributed throughout spring, summer, and fall 2025 outreach.

3. Be A Looker – Go Coast's bicycle and pedestrian safety campaign, Be A Looker, kicked off its current campaign year in April. The campaign was initially launched in 2019 with safety messages featured year-round, but the campaign is promoted biennially with paid advertising and media coverage. A temporary display booth featuring Be a Looker has been installed at Independence Mall.

Wave participated in Wilmington Earth Day Alliance's 2025 Festival where staff conducted outreach providing information on Wave's various transit services and programs. Wave also provided a shuttle for the event to assist with minimizing congestion and parking issues associated with the event.





Seasonal Trolley Service Back Connecting Downtown Sites & Attractions

Wave's Port City Trolley started back this spring operating 7 days a week through September 2025. The Trolley is operating on a new route and schedule approved as part of the Reimagine Wave Initiative intended to provide a more consistent and easier-to-understand route and schedule.
