#### 1. Call to Order

Mike Kozlosky called the meeting to order at 10:01am and took roll call.

## 2. Approval of the Agenda

Virginia Norris made a motion to approve the agenda, seconded by Dennis Vielkanowitz. The motion passed unanimously.

#### 3. Presentations

a. Cape Fear Navigating Change 2050 Plan Update – Abby Lorenzo, WMPO
Abby Lorenzo introduced Greer Templer, WMPO Senior Transportation Planner, who overviewed the final stage of the Cape Fear Navigating Change 2050 Plan. Ms.
Templer explained that the MTP identifies the region's transportation needs and provides a blueprint for the next 25 years. She went over the requirements by Federal Law for an MTP and highlighted the plan development process, as well as where the WMPO is currently in that process. Ms. Templer reviewed the first public outreach phase that was completed to collect necessary data for the plan, the modal project scoring and policy development, how regional priority projects were identified, and the financial forecast for funding projects through 2050. Ms. Templer stated that the financial forecast included looking at alternative funding/revenue opportunities or options. At this point in her presentation, Ms. Templer defined the second public outreach phase and all the outreach events that were a part of it. In conclusion of her presentation, Ms. Templer highlighted the six chapters of the Cape Fear Navigating Change 2050 plan, the appendices and how the MTP will be used.

Greer Templer asked if there were any questions; Mark Hairr asked if there is any impact from the Alternative Funding Committee that could be incorporated in the MTP. Mike Kozlosky clarified that the WMPO Board wanted to include all the funding options in the MTP, stating that the only projects that are fiscally constrained using alternative funding are the replacement of the Cape Fear Memorial Bridge and the Cape Fear Crossing.

## b. Get There Greener Update - Carolyn Caggia, WMPO

Carolyn Caggia gave a presentation explaining the Get There Greener/Bike to Work Day Challenge. Ms. Caggia defined what the challenge is, how anyone can participate and the rewards from participating. Ms. Caggia concluded her presentation by highlighting the second annual Bike To Work Day taking place on October 17, 2025, letting everyone know how to sign up to participate.

Ms. Caggia asked if there were any questions, Virginia Norris asked how the committee was promoting this to local businesses, Ms. Caggia stated they are contacting them directly.

Nazia Sarder made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda; Sam Boswell seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

#### 5. Regular Agenda

a. Resolution requesting a modification to the 2024-2033 and 2026-2035 State/MPO Transportation Improvement Programs for the Carolina Beach Road/College Road intersection improvements (W-5703C)

Mike Kozlosky overviewed the resolution before the committee, stating that the NCDOT has a highway safety project from US 117/NC 132 to 200 feet north of Wiloughby Park to install curb and gutter, multi-use path, sidewalk, pedestrian signals, crosswalks and lighting. Mr. Kozlosky stated that in September 2022, New Hanover County requested Direct Attributable funding from WMPO in the amount of \$461,949 for 2,600 linear feet of multi-use path and committed the required local match of \$115,488. This request was approved in October of 2022. Due to costs of the plan and lack of grant funds, the multi-use trail has been replaced with a sidewalk and because the funds from the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization and New Hanover County were related to the multi-use path, there will not be a need for the cost share as it was originally agreed upon. Mr. Kozlosky explained that the resolution is requesting a modification to the 2024-2033 and 2026-2035 State/MPO Transportation Improvement Programs.

Karlene Ellis Vitallis expressed her management's concerns about replacing the multi-use path with a sidewalk. Denys Vielkanowitz asked if there were physical restraints to install the multi-use path, Adrienne Cox replied it was fiscal constraints that changed the plan to a sidewalk. Tabling the item on the agenda was discussed but it was decided not to table it at this time.

Eric Ritzel made a motion to approve the resolution; Nazia Sarder seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

**WHEREAS,** the Wilmington Regional Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) Strategic Deployment Plan focuses on assembling a multiagency strategy for investing in transportation technologies with the purpose of serving as a roadmap for implementing and investing in ITS technologies and strategies based on the existing infrastructure, current conditions, and needs of the region; and

WHEREAS, the project team coordinated with a broad range of participants and stakeholders throughout the development of the plan to receive feedback and ensure regional alignment; and

WHEREAS, the recommendations in this plan support opportunities for funding technology-focused projects and providing guidance for preliminary scoping content for strategies aligned with regional goals.

**NOW THEREFORE**, be it resolved that the Board of the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization hereby adopts the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization's Regional ITS Strategic Deployment Plan.

Dear Mr. Kozlosky,

In 2021, the Town of Kure Beach was awarded \$360,000 total from both the Coronavirus Response and Recovery Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA) and the Surface Transportation Block Grant – Direct Attributable (STBGPA – DA) program for the Fort Fisher Boulevard and K Avenue Intersection Project (BL-0059). At that time, the engineer's opinion of probable cost was \$422,500. The Town of Kure Beach applied for \$360,000 and agreed to a \$62,500 local match. The Town partnered with WithersRavenel to complete preliminary engineering (PE) work and to manage right-of-way (ROW) negotiations. The engineer's opinion of probable cost to construct the project according to 100% final design document is \$520,000. ROW negotiations yield ROW costs in the amount of \$270,000.

The previous grant award has been spent on PE; the remaining balance will be spent on construction inspection services. To complete the project, a total of \$790,000 is needed for ROW and construction. The Town of Kure Beach would like to request a total of \$632,000 (80% of the funds needed) from the WMPO's STBGPA-DA program. The Town is committed to providing a match in the amount of \$158,000 (20% of the funds needed) to fully fund ROW and construction to complete the project.

WHEREAS, on July 18, 2012, the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (WMPO) was designated a Transportation Management Area (TMA); and

**WHEREAS**, as a TMA, the WMPO is a direct recipient of Surface Transportation Block Grant – Direct Attributable (STBGPA – DA) funds; and

WHEREAS, the Coronavirus Response and Recovery Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA) appropriated funding to TMAs including an additional \$1,481,000 for distribution to the WMPO for qualified projects within the WMPO service boundary; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Kure Beach is a member jurisdiction and within the service boundary of the WMPO; and

WHEREAS, in 2021 the Town of Kure Beach applied to the WMPO and received CRRSAA and STBGPA - DA funds in the amount of \$360,000 towards the \$422,500 total cost to design and construct pedestrian improvements at the intersection of Ft. Fisher Boulevard and K Avenue (BL-0059) and provided a \$62,500 local match; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Kure Beach contracted with WithersRavenel to complete the preliminary engineering (PE) work that is completed to 100% final design; and

**WHEREAS**, right-of-way (ROW) negotiations yield \$270,000 in ROW costs, the construction opinion of probable cost is \$520,000, and both exceed the CRRSAA and STBGPA – DA grant award for the project; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Kure Beach is requesting \$216,000 for ROW (80% of ROW costs) and will match \$54,000 (20% of ROW costs); and

**WHEREAS,** The Town of Kure Beach is requesting \$416,000 for construction (80% of construction costs) and will match \$104,000 (20% of construction costs) in STBGPA – DA funds.

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED**, the Kure Beach Town Council supports the request to the WMPO for additional funding in the total amount of \$632,000 (80% of total cost) for BL-0059 and will provide a match in the amount of \$158,000 (20% of total cost).

WHEREAS, on July 18, 2012, the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) and the Federal Highways Administration (FHWA) designated the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization as a Transportation Management Area (TMA); and

WHEREAS, Direct Attributable funds are available for all designated TMAs; and

WHEREAS, in October 2021 the Town of Kure Beach was awarded Coronavirus Response and Recovery Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) funding in the amount of \$359,559 for the Fort Fisher Boulevard and K Avenue intersection improvement project (BL-0059); and

WHEREAS, when the agreement was developed, the funding was modified to \$110,000 in CRRSAA funding and \$250,000 in Surface Transportation Block Grant- Direct Attributable (STBG-DA) funding for a total of \$360,000; and

WHEREAS, the Town committed funding in the amount of \$62,500 (20%) to match the STBG-DA allocation for this award; and

WHEREAS, the negotiated right-of-way costs and anticipated construction costs both exceed the CRRSAA and STBG-DA allocations; and

WHEREAS, the Town is requesting an additional \$216,000 (80%) in Direct Attributable funding and will provide a local match in the amount of \$54,000 (20%) for right-of-way acquisition; and

WHEREAS, the Town is requesting an additional \$416,000 (80%) in Direct Attributable funding and will provide a local match in the amount of \$104,000 (20%) for construction of the intersection improvements.

**NOW THEREFORE,** be it resolved that the Board of the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization hereby supports the allocation of additional Direct Attributable funding to the Town of Kure Beach in the amount of \$632,000 with the Town providing a local match in the amount of \$158,000 for the Fort Fisher Boulevard and K Avenue intersection improvement project (BL-0059).

## WMPO Planning and Project Updates October 2025

# **Long-Range Planning Activities:**

# **CAPE FEAR NAVIGATING CHANGE**

**Project Description/Scope:** The WMPO is progressing through the planning process for our region's 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), Cape Fear Navigating Change 2050. A long-range Metropolitan Transportation Plan for the region is federally required and must be developed, updated, and adopted by the WMPO every five years. The final plan will be used by federal, state, and local governments to guide decision-making for transportation projects in our region over the next 25 years, including which projects receive state or federal funding, the design and location of local roadways, coordinating land use and development, and identifying projects for further plans and studies. Planning activities began in April of 2023 with plan adoption expected in October of 2025.

#### **2050 MTP Final Document**

WMPO staff have finalized the Cape Fear Navigating Change 2050 plan, incorporating revisions informed by feedback gathered through Phase II of public outreach on the draft plan. With these updates complete, the plan is ready for presentation to the WMPO's TCC and Board for adoption consideration.

# **Project Status and Next Steps:**

- The final Cape Fear Navigating Change 2050 plan was completed at the end of August, published on the WMPO website, and provided in print to Board members at the September meetings.
- The final plan was presented to the TCC in September and will be presented to the Board in October, with both committees scheduled to consider adoption at their October 2025 meetings.
- Following WMPO plan adoption, professional printing will be undertaken to produce the final published version, and staff will present the plan to the governing bodies of each member jurisdiction for their consideration of adoption throughout November 2025.

### SAFE STREETS AND ROADS FOR ALL SAFETY ACTION PLAN

**Project Description/Scope:** The WMPO has begun work on its Safety Action Plan with the help of consultants Kittelson and Associates. Safety Action Plans are comprehensive safety plans aimed at reducing and eliminating serious-injury and fatal crashes affecting all roadway users. They are developed through data analysis and community input to identify significant safety risks which inform recommended countermeasures, strategies, and policies which aim to reduce crash severity and save lives. Planning activities for this effort began in April 2025 with plan adoption expected in Fall 2026.

#### **Project Status and Next Steps:**

- The vision and goals have been finalized for the plan.
- Data analysis and plan review is ongoing for the existing conditions phase.
- The SS4A Safety Action Plan Leadership Commitment was approved by the WMPO TCC and Board in July.

- The second Steering Committee meeting was held in August.
- Round 1 of public outreach ended on September 30, with over 540 survey responses and nearly 400 map comments.
- WMPO hosted 3 open houses and participated in five pop-up events to solicit feedback from the public throughout Round 1.
- The next round of public outreach will begin in December 2025 and will focus on draft countermeasures and safety improvements.
- A draft of the Safety Action plan is expected in early 2026.

## INTELLIGENT TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM PLAN

Project Description/Scope: The WMPO has begun work on the development of an Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) Plan to guide the coordinated deployment and integration of technology-based transportation solutions across the region. The plan will assess existing ITS infrastructure, identify gaps and opportunities, and establish a regional architecture that aligns with state and federal standards. Its scope includes strategies to improve traffic signal coordination, incident management, traveler information systems, transit technology integration, and data sharing among agencies. The ITS Plan will serve as a strategic framework to enhance system efficiency, safety, and real-time responsiveness, supporting the WMPO's broader goals of improving mobility, reducing congestion, and fostering regional collaboration.

## **Project Status and Next Steps:**

- WMPO staff initiated the project with consultants Kimley-Horn in December 2024 to outline the development process and next steps.
- The first core team meeting was held at the WMPO office on January 27, 2025.
- Subsequent core team meetings took place on March 10 and March 31.
- Stakeholder workshops 1 and 2 were held at the WMPO office on February 18 and April 29.
- One-on-one core team stakeholder meetings have been completed and the first stage of revision following core team input has been ongoing.
- The Core Team received the draft Regional ITS Plan for review the week of August 4. Comments provided by the Core Team were addressed.
- The final core team meeting was held virtually on August 20.
- The final planning document and architecture content was provided to Core Team at the end of September, with comments provided on the draft plan being addressed and incorporated.
- The final plan will be presented to the WMPO TCC and Board in October 2025.
- The ITS plan remains on schedule for completion in 2025.

### **Locally Administered Project Program (LAPP)**

The WMPO was designated as a Transportation Management Area (TMA) in 2012 following the 2010 decennial census, when the urban area was found to have exceeded 200,000 in population. As a TMA, the WMPO receives an annual direct allocation of approximately \$6 million in federal Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG), Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside (TASA), and Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) funding. Through a WMPO-developed and adopted competitive process, the funding is awarded to member jurisdictions and planning partners for developing and implementing local transportation projects. The current statuses of these ongoing projects are as follows:

# <u>BL – 0059 TOWN OF KURE BEACH - FORT FISHER BOULEVARD/K AVENUE AND NORTH 3RD STREET PEDESTRIAN SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS</u>

**Project Description/Scope:** This project entails intersection improvements at Ft. Fisher Boulevard and K Avenue to include high visibility crosswalks, ADA ramps, and pedestrian signals; and filling gaps in the sidewalk network on Ft. Fisher Boulevard and N. 3rd Street that will create a pedestrian network connected to the Ft. Fisher Boulevard and K Avenue intersection.

# **Project Status and Next Steps:**

• Approaching project close out, a ribbon cutting ceremony will be announced at a later date.

#### TC – 0021 WAVE PASSENGER AMENITIES AND UPGRADES

**Project Description/Scope:** Cape Fear Public Transportation Authority (WAVE transit) currently has a total of 440 bus stops, 24 benches and 27 shelters. Shelters only represent 6% of our passenger amenities, while other NC agencies average 14%. To meet the peer average for statewide systems, CFPTA needs to install an additional twenty-six (26) benches and twenty (20) shelters. This project will support the installation of a total of nine (9) bus stop benches and ten (10) bus stop shelters along eight (8) transit routes located within the City of Wilmington. The project includes engineering and design, construction of concrete pads, ADA ramps, ADA access, and purchase and installation of durable bench and/or shelter, waste receptacle, and solar lighting, where applicable.

## TRANSPORTATION DEMAND MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

**Project Description/Scope:** The TDM "Go Coast" program works to increase the use of alternative transportation by WMPO residents and decrease Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT). The WMPO Board approved Cape Fear Change in Motion 2020, the short-range TDM Plan which will guide Go Coast initiatives from 2021 to 2025. This plan identifies seven short-range strategies to increase mobility options and reduce traffic in the WMPO region. These strategies are: Alternative Work Schedules, Bike Share Program, Carpool and Vanpool, Consulting for Telecommuting Opportunities, Fostering a Bicycle and Pedestrian Friendly Culture, Improved TDM-Focused Collaboration, and Personalized Commuter Plans. The update to the short-range TDM plan is incorporated into the WMPO's MTP currently under development, Cape Fear Navigating Change 2050, and contains a detailed work plan for Go Coast spanning from 2026 to 2030. The plan update will be up for consideration for adoption in October 2025, alongside the MTP, as it is a component of the MTP.

#### Go Coast current initiatives and project status:

- Go Coast Committee The next regular Go Coast committee meeting is scheduled to occur virtually on Thursday, November 20, from 3-5 p.m.
- Bicycle Helmet Initiative –WMPO staff applied for and received 100 more children's bicycle helmets through NCDOT's 2025 grant cycle for the Bicycle Helmet Initiative. Helmets are being distributed throughout spring, summer, and fall 2025 outreach.
- Get There Greener Go Coast is hosting its annual sustainable transportation challenge, Get There Greener, in October 2025. Participants who track a trip by bicycling, walking,

- carpooling, public transportation, or teleworking in place of driving alone get entered into prize drawings. This year local businesses have generously provided over \$1,200 worth of prizes to support the challenge. Learn more at gocoastnc.org/get-there-greener

# **Wave Takes Delivery of 4 New ADA Paratransit Vehicles**

Wave recently added four (4) new ADA paratransit vehicles to its fleet for its DART service. These vehicles are fully ADA accessible and are designed specifically for point-to-point trips for individuals with disabilities who are certified for this service. These four new 2026 model vehicles cost \$447,112 with 80% of the funding provided by a Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5339 Capital Grant and 20% provided by the City of Wilmington and New Hanover County for the required local match.



# **Ridership**

In September 2025, Wave Transit's fixed-route service tentatively recorded 57,035 fixed-route passenger trips. This data is preliminary and may be revised once finalized. Additionally, the RideMICRO service reported 3,222 passenger trips during the same period, which exceeds the highest amount ever in the program by over 1,000 trips. This increase is due to expanded service implemented in July which has opened up service to more individuals in need of RideMICRO trips to access their destination, or the nearest Wave transfer point.

#### **Latest News**

- A Great Trails economic impact video was created by the Communications team in partnership with Piedmont Land Conservancy, Piedmont Legacy Trails and The Great Trails State of NC.
- McDowell County's new microtransit program, McDowell Express, is off to a strong start in Marion. The new on-demand public transit service launched May 1, to better connect rural communities with jobs, healthcare, education and more. The program has provided more than 1,900 rides since then with steady month-overmonth growth.
- The FY 27 grant cycle is currently open for transit agencies across North Carolina to apply for federal and state funding to support their transit operations. Funding received from the Integrated Mobility Division (IMD) will support various needs for the transit agencies, including providing funding for capital needs and administrative and operating assistance.
  - This funding will also support the transit agencies and non-profit organizations in the provision of transit services designed to meet the mobility needs of their communities.
  - The application cycle will close on Oct. 3, 2025. Following the grant cycle closure, IMD staff will review all funding applications to ensure they meet federal and state eligibility requirements and other applicable regulations. In a typical grant cycle, IMD staff will review and approve more than 350 applications.

#### **Safe Routes to School**

 IMD is planning a local Walk to School Day with Hunter Magnet Elementary School in Raleigh on Oct. 8.

- NCDOT staff, students, local authorities and other partners will participate.
- This year we have 93+ schools represented the State of North Carolina in this year's Walk & Roll to School National Event.
- Through the North Carolina Safe Routes to School program, NCDOT works to make walking and riding a bicycle to school a safe and more appealing options for all children.
- The program facilitates the planning, development and implementation of projects and activities to improve safety and reduce traffic, fuel consumption and air quality near K-12 schools.

# Improved and Expanded Intercity Bus Service

- Since the relaunch of Asheville and Chapel Hill's intercity bus service on Aug.
   1, there have been nearly 1600 riders.
  - o Asheville 1,548
  - o Chapel Hill < 100
- The Asheville service restored vital connections to cities like Charlotte, Raleigh and Greensboro and provides riders access to destinations across the U.S. This information was shared via press release, tv, newspapers and on social media platforms.
- Chapel Hill's intercity bus service's new stop, at Eubanks Road Park and Ride has now established intercity bus service at all major universities in the state is a priority for IMD. This was shared via press release and on social media.
